Pitcher Jerry Cade and first baseman Bill Duncan were sidelined on doctor's orders after they were injured in an automobile accident near Woodburn Sunday. Cade received facial lacerations and a sprain of his pitching arm. Duncan has a scalp injury as a result of the wreck which occurred when the players' car ran off the road.

George LeGrand, who played first base against Gold Beach, turned in an impressive performance with three hits in four times at the plate. Don Joslyn pitched for the Warriors, and Bill Gordon caught.

'Stan The Man' Still Holding Batting Title

NEW YORK, May 16 —(P)—Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals owned an 85-point bulge over his closest pursuer today in the race for the individual batting title of the National league.

The clouting infielder-outfielder, through games of Sunday had collected 35 base hits in 75 times at bat for a sensational .467 figure. Dick Sisler of the Philadelphia Phillies was runnerup with .382 based on 34 hits in 89 times at bat. Andy Pafo of the Chicago Cubs, second a week ago, slipped to third. A mild slump dropped his average from .435 to .375. Johnny Hopp of Pittsburgh, who enjoyed six hits in the second game of Sunday's doubleheader, picked up some 70 points to climb into fourth place with a mark of .363.

Tommy Glaviano, emergency third baseman of the Cards, was in fifth place with .337. Sam Jethroe, only rookie in the top ten, was sixth with .343. The Boston Braves outfielder was tied with Musial for the most hits, 35. Ed Warkus, Philadelphia's "comeback kid," was seventh with

.330, one point higher than the .329 sported by Jackie Robinson of Brooklyn and last year's batting king, Johnny Wyrostek of Cincinnati. .328; and Del Ennis of Philadelphia, .324, rounded out the big ten.

Layzell, nine-year-old Rose school pupil, took first place honors in class A competition (ages 6-12) and runner-up was Schweppe, age 12 from Roseburg Junior high. James Hodson, state runner-up in last year's tournament and a 13-year-old junior high student, won first place in class B (ages 13-15). Second place in B division went to Jerry Long, 14, from junior high.

Medals to the three winners of the school district 4 play-offs went to Hodson, Long and Ronnie Sheppard, all of the junior high school. Roseburg tournament winners will compete against the best in the state Saturday. The state winner be given an expense-free trip to Eaton Rapids, Mich., to participate in the annual veterans of Foreign Wars National Marble tournament.
