Cafe Near Glide Will Be Rebuilt

Plans are now under way to replace as soon as possible the Royal Coachman cafe, which was located on the North Umpqua highway, three miles above Glide. The eating place, long famous for its fried chicken, was completely destroyed by fire of an undetermined origin which started in the early morning hours Friday, and burned everything, including all equipment. Only the colorful sign of the Royal Coachman, located on the opposite side of the highway remains to mark the previous site of the eating place.

Arthur A. Atkins, who purchased the Coachman in January, reports that he is working out plans for his new building with L. K. Cornwell, Roseburg contractor and hopes to start construction immediately. When asked what type of building the new cafe would be, Atkins announced firmly, "fire-proof," and added that construction would undoubtedly be of pumice block. Fire losses were estimated to be around \$15,000.

Columbia's Rise Over Flood Stage Saturday Forecast

PORTLAND, — (AP) — The Columbia river is forecast to rise above flood stage at Vancouver, Wash., Saturday for the first time during the spring freshet.

The rise is likely to mark the start of high water that will prevail until the river hits its crest in mid-June.

The weather bureau said the river, now at 12.8 feet, would probably reach 15.5 feet Saturday and 18.1 feet Sunday. Flood stage is 15 feet.

That rise will do no damage. It would flood some unoccupied lowland.

River forecaster Elmer Fisher said the river might drop a little later, but probably would not fall below flood stage again until the crest has passed. A peak of 25 to 26 feet is forecast for mid-June.

Fisher forecast a continued slow rise of the lower Snake river. The upper Columbia river, dropping slightly at some stations in the wake of cooler weather, is not likely to show any great changes in the next few days.

It is still too cool in the snow belt to start any full-scale runoff, Fisher said. There is some melting in the daytime, but none at night.

Iodine is naturally present in ocean salt but is lost in refining.

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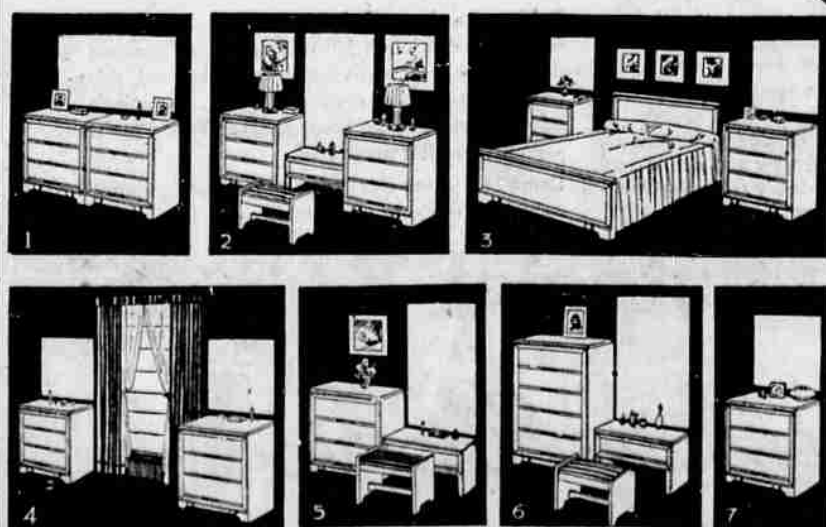
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
