Bishop Of Oregon Scores Senator

PORTLAND, May 19 (AP)—The Methodist bishop of Oregon Thursday in a sharp attack condemned the actions of Wisconsin's Senator McCarthy. Speaking before the Oregon State conference on social work, Bishop Gerald Kennedy declared that McCarthy's attack on the State department has created unwarranted division and distrust. "We are living in shabby times," the bishop said. "Any generation that can produce a McCarthy doesn't have anything to brag about." The bishop also extended his criticism to the news coverage of McCarthy's attack. "The press ought to be called to account for its handling of the McCarthy case," he said. "The press has a real obligation to play down the antics of this man." The comments were a sidelight of the bishop's main address, which was chiefly devoted to the contrast between the philosophies of democracy and totalitarianism.

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'Painless' Parker Lags On Alimony, Ex-Wife Says
SAN JOSE, Calif., May 19 (AP)—A 35-year-old mother today asked the state to help support her two young sons. She complained her divorced husband has defaulted on his alimony.

The lads are Edgar R. Parker III, 9, and Ronald Parker, age 5, grandsons of Edgar (Painless) Parker, well-known dentist.

Their mother, Mrs. Kathryn Parker, said Edgar Parker II, the boy's father, a dentist in Portland, Ore., was ordered by Santa Clara superior court to pay her \$500 a month.

But, she said, she has received no money from him since January, 1948.

Catholic Bishop Of Seattle Dies

SEATTLE, May 19 (AP)—The Most Rev. Gerald Shaughnessy, Catholic bishop for the diocese of Seattle, died Thursday after an illness of nearly three years. He would have been 63 years old tomorrow.

Bishop Shaughnessy had been the head of the diocese since 1933. He had been widely known previously as an educator.

He was the fourth bishop of the 100-year-old diocese.

Under church law, the Most Rev. Thomas A. Connolly will become the bishop. Pope Pius XII named him coadjutor bishop in 1948 because of Bishop Shaughnessy's serious illness. Since that time he has been assisting in administering the western Washington diocese, which embraces 109 parishes and 150,000 Catholics.

As a member of the Society of Mary, Bishop Shaughnessy was the first bishop of Seattle belonging to an order whose vows are stricter than the so-called secular priests.

He was ordained to the priesthood in 1920.

QUANTITY VS. QUALITY
SEOUL, Korea, (AP)—An American welfare worker complained when she learned the Seoul city government will honor mothers of 10 or more living children.

"This would be of some value if mothers of the healthiest children were honored instead of using a quantity measure," snapped Mildred Barody, health and safety specialist of the Economic co-operation administration's industry branch.

But city workers went their blissful way totaling the score. Last count: 84 mothers, the champion with 15 children.

Two 'Bail Out' From Crash-Blast Of Plane

WEST CHESTER, Pa., May 19 (AP)—An air force jet plane crashed and exploded last night after the pilot and his passenger had parachuted to safety in a heavy rainstorm.

The pilot, Major Richard H. Burner, 31, of Washington, escaped without injury. His passenger, Second Lieut. C. H. Criscivene, 23, sustained a cut lip.

The two-seater jet fighter training plane crashed near Lionville, Pa., about seven miles from where the two fliers came to earth. The wreckage was scattered over a mile area of farming country.

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
