

Sen. Morse Wins Nomination In Primary Election

Threatened Strike Of Switchmen Criticized
CHICAGO, May 20.—(AP)—The threatened strike Tuesday of AFL switchmen against 10 railroads, the Western Association of Railroads said today, "is wholly unjustified."
"This strike threat," the association said in a statement, "is a reckless drive for prestige—an attempt by one small union to outsmart and outdo a big rival union."
Only government intervention could avert the scheduled walkout—set for 6 a.m. against the 10 mid-western and western lines. Although no word came from the White House in Washington after the strike call Wednesday night, the National (railway) Mediation board was expected to be called in and attempt to settle the wage-hour dispute.
