

Student Body Of Jr. High School Elects Officers

Roseburg junior high school student body elections for the fall semester of the next school year were held this week.

Those elected to office were: David Morgan, president; Marsha Lehrbach, vice-president; Joan Phillips, secretary; Howard Backen, treasurer; and Robert Frasier, sergeant-at-arms and, automatically, leader of the school's service club, a general utility group.

These students will all be eighth graders next year. The reason all officers are eighth graders is because the junior high ninth grade will become part of the senior high school, as of next school year.

In the fall, representatives from each home room will be elected. These, 16 in all, and the ASB officers will compose the student council. Eight will be elected from the eighth grade home rooms and eight from the seventh grade home rooms.

In class elections, the ninth graders (who will be senior high freshmen next year) elected Virgil Guthrie as representative to the student council, Donna Ellison as class president, Jim Kern as vice-president, Leola Lorenzen as secretary and Lucinda Randall as treasurer.

The sophomores (present ninth graders) elected Roger Oilar as council representative, Tom Burke president of the class, Michael Wootton vice president, Shirley Wilkinson secretary, and Patty Roark treasurer.

Two positions on the Douglas county non-high school board are to be filled in the school election June 19, announced County School Superintendent Kenneth Barneburg.

One is in Zone 5, which includes Anchor, Booth, Tiller, Galesville and Gazley. The term is for five years. Mrs. Sylvia Jantzer of Azalea is the present board member.

The other is in Zone 4, embracing Tenmile, Roberts Creek, upper Olalla and Dillard. C. C. Fosback of Dillard is the present incumbent. The person elected will fill an unexpired three-year term.

The filing date for petitions is June 3. Candidates must file their acceptance 10 days prior to the date of voting. A petition must bear the names of at least 30 legal voters.

Barneburg announced that two persons, the present incumbents in each case, have filed for election to the county rural school board. The election for these positions will also take place June 19, but the deadline for filing is Saturday of this week.

Mrs. Madeline B. Cool, Drain, has filed for director from Zone B, while Gilbert Weaver, Myrtle Creek, has filed for Zone D.

S. F. Railway System At Last Showing Profit

SAN FRANCISCO, May 20.—(P)—Today is a red letter day for San Francisco's municipal railway system.

It announced a profit of \$29,171.26 for April—the first time the system has ended a month out of the red since the city took over the old Market street railway system, nearly a decade ago.

Utilities Manager James H. Turner said the use of trolley coaches did the trick. The new trolleys made a profit of \$97,514 last month. Streetcars lost \$48,108 for the city, cable cars \$14,428.37 and buses \$5,806.37.

EUGENE, Ore., May 20.—(P)—Application by mail won for an Idaho girl the editorship of the Oregon Daily Emerald, university student newspaper.

Priest Relents, Assents To Rank Of Archbishop

ROME, — (P)—Franz Jachym of Vienna — the earnest, 38-year-old priest who last month protested he was not worthy of an archbishop's rank — has been raised to the position in Solemn Roman Catholic consecration rites here.

With downcast eyes and a face showing intense emotional stress, the new titular archbishop of Maronea moved among 2,000 German and Austrian holy year pilgrims, moving his right hand in his first episcopal blessing. He is one of the youngest priests to hold such high church office.

Msgr. Jachym caused a stir of comment when he dramatically refused to be consecrated in Vienna April 23 and walked out of the church. Pope Pius XII later refused to accept Msgr. Jachym's decision.

The priest gave no indication of the reasons that had prompted him to his action in Vienna. Rome's Quotidiano, official organ of Italian Catholic action, in a comment upon his earlier action said there had been many instances of prelates who thought themselves unworthy of such honor but who later gave in to higher authority.

Theodor Cardinal Innitzer, archbishop of Vienna, served as consecrating bishop at the ceremonies in the German church in Rome, St. Mary's dell'Anima.

The ceremony was lighted by flashes from a battery of photographers. At one point, as Msgr. Jachym lay prostrate at the altar, photographers filed close by, in single file, taking pictures with photoflash bulbs.

Dr. Hugh I. Evans Named Presbyterian Moderator

CINCINNATI, May 20.—(P)—A 63-year-old Dayton, O., minister took over his duties today as moderator of the General assembly of the Presbyterian church of the U. S. A.

Dr. Hugh Ivan Evans, pastor of the Westminster Presbyterian church for the past 26 years, was elected moderator yesterday over two other nominees and will preside over the assembly during the next year.

The new moderator was born on a farm near Scott (Van Wert county), Ohio.

He is a graduate of the College of Wooster and Princeton theological seminary. Before going to Dayton he served as pastor of churches at Gallipolis, Marysville and Portsmouth, O.

Church Pleads For Return Of Stolen Statue

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica, May 20.—(P)—The Roman Catholic church appealed by radio today for the return of the stolen Virgin of the Angels, venerated as Costa Rica's patroness. The thieves were told to keep the gold and jewels, worth an estimated \$1,000,000, ornamenting the black rock statue.

The 300-year-old figure was stolen last Friday from the basilica at Cartago, 30 miles southeast of San Jose. Rewards totalling \$600,000 have been offered for its return and three days of national mourning for the loss were declared.

Court To Eye Will On Covers Of Magazine

LOS ANGELES, May 20.—(P)—The superior court is going to have to determine the legal value of a woman's will written in pencil on the front and back covers of a pocket size magazine.

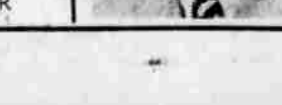
The document purportedly was written by Mrs. Violet R. Jordan, 65, who died last Feb. 20, leaving a \$30,000 estate. Her son, William J. Jordan Jr., sent the will to the county clerk's probate division, although not offering it for probate.

The will, dated Jan. 6, 1948, leaves half the estate in trust for a crippled children's hospital. There is no such institution and no hospital at the address given.

One-fourth of the estate, says the will, is to go to Mrs. Jordan's husband, William J. Jordan, Washington, D. C., and the remaining one-fourth to his sisters.
