

More Submarines Urged By Secretary Of Navy

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Observing that the United States almost lost two wars to submarines, Secretary of the Navy Matthews has called for a stepped up sub construction program in this country.

He said the navy needs more undersea craft for possible use as guided missile launchers, for use against other subs and for other purposes.

Speaking to reporters on the occasion of his first anniversary in office, Matthews said that while much progress has been made in anti-submarine preparations, more U. S. subs still are needed.

"We have 70," he said; "The Russians have 270."

Actually, while this country has only about 70 submarines on active duty, 92 more are in mothballs, six modern types are under construction, and three half-size subs are being built for anti-submarine warfare.

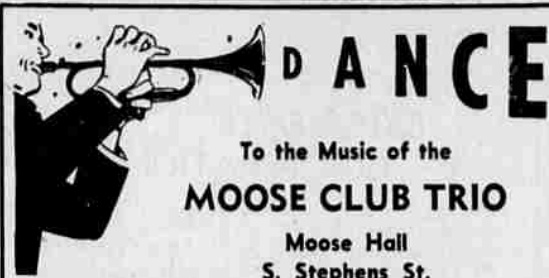
Matthews' year in office spanned a period when Navy criticism of pentagon policies ran high.

Recalled Ashland Officials Retire

ASHLAND, May 26—(AP)—There was at least a temporary peace today in this city of recurrent recalls.

The latest two officials to be recalled quietly left office yesterday, and there was no cry of protest in the air today.

Earlier one of the recalled officials, Mayor Tom Williams, had threatened to contest the voting that removed him.

That was when two tally sheets were missing as the official canvass of votes began Tuesday. The missing sheets, however, turned up yesterday in another ballot box when it was unlocked at the courthouse.

The canvass of votes then proceeded, and when it was over, Williams and Councilman Elmer Sheldon, who also was recalled, quietly left the council chambers.

Councilman Fred Homes, an opponent of Williams, took over as acting mayor. The five councilmen still in office will appoint a new mayor and another councilman.

Homes took his first official act, naming Harold R. Jordan as city judge. The term of L. P. Wilmett ended automatically when Williams left office. Wilmett was appointed by Williams after having served as Williams' campaign manager in the 1948 election.

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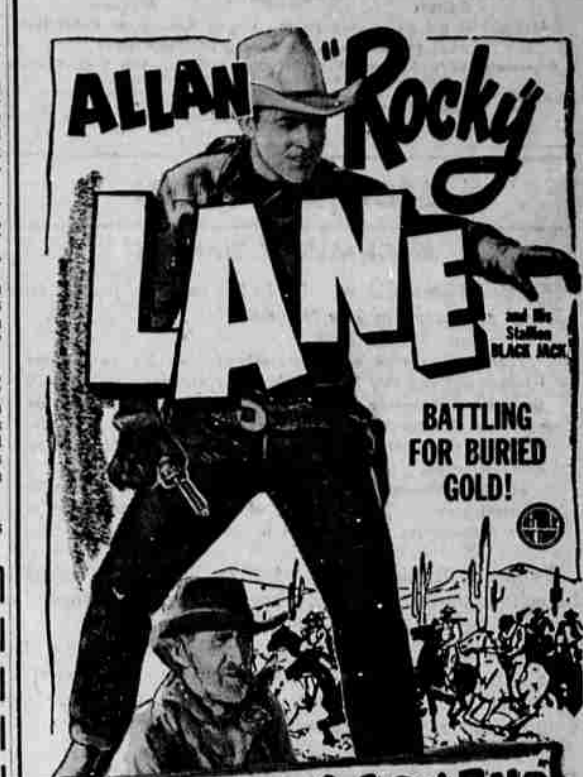
