Provost Tops Golf Tourney With 72 Score

Stafford, Birkenhead, Hixson Battle Provost For Championship Cup

The fourth annual Roseburg invitational golf tournament moved into the third day of play with Dom Provost, Lou Stafford, Joe Birkenhead and Harvey Hixson surviving the first elimination round in the championship flight bracket.

Birkenhead is the defending champion of the tournament. He decided not to qualify and was given the automatic position allotted the defending champion.

Provost, University of Oregon golf star, turned in the low qualifying score and led for medalist honors with an even par score of 72.

Lou Stafford, a former University of Oregon golfer, was runnerup for medalist honors with a four over par score of 76.

Chiefs Post Thrilling 7-6 Win Over Ashland As DeBernardi Hits Homer

The Roseburg Umpqua Chiefs scored an exciting 7-6 victory over the Ashland Lithians Sunday afternoon in a Southern Oregon league game at Ashland.

The Chiefs, after coasting along on a 6-1 lead, found themselves surprised in the last of the eighth inning, when Ashland went on a batting spree and scored five runs to tie the score.

Roseburg pitcher Bus Sporer had pitched a 2-hit ball game up to the eighth, when Lithian first baseman Tex Gatlin started off the rally by working a walk off the Roseburg pitcher, which incidentally was the only walk given up by Sporer in the entire game.

With the score tied 6-6 in the first of the ninth, the Chiefs managed to score a run when catcher Tex Chandler scored on pinch hitter Bunky Hill's fielder's choice.

Sporer then struck out two of three Ashland hitters in the last of the ninth, the other out coming on a ground ball to third.

The Chiefs started the scoring in the top of the fourth inning, when Stan Norby scored on Sporer's single to short center. Roseburg added four more in the fifth when George Sanders walked, Norm West and Norby singled, and Dick DeBernardi cleared the sacks with a home run.

Roseburg got its other run in the eighth when Lovell Baker scored on the Lithian's right fielder's error on Virg Sanders' hit.

West, Norby and Sporer were the outstanding hitters for the Chiefs, each getting two hits, and Norby and DeBernardi each batted in two runs. West severely injured his knee in the third inning, while sliding in home, but remained in the game.

Only two of Ashland's runs were earned, while Roseburg earned five. Sporer struck out 10 batters, and Gray of Ashland struck out three.

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Drain High Wins State B School Crown

Amity Beaten By 11 to 1; Roosevelt Of Portland Wins Over Eugene 7-0

ALBANY, Or., May 29.—(P)—Defending champions Roosevelt of Portland and Drain of Douglas county recaptured states high school baseball titles Saturday night.

Roosevelt took the class A division crown with a 7 to 0 triumph over Eugene behind the one-hit pitching of Bill Bottler. Drain retained the class B trophy by overwhelming Amity, 11 to 1, with southpaw Jerry Cade setting a strikeout record.

Earlier in the last day of play, Albany defeated Hillsboro, 1 to 0, for class A third place and Aumsville defeated Union, 9 to 2, for the same spot in class B competition.

Roosevelt's Bottler didn't walk a man and fanned 17 batters as he set down Eugene. He had a no-hitter until the seventh inning, when Bob Scott bunted down the first base line. He stole second but was thrown out attempting to steal third. The only other Eugene man to get on base was Mel Jefferies, whose grounder was booted by second baseman Paul Poetsch.

In the Drain-Amity game, the lone Amity run came on catcher Rus Taylor's home run in the fourth inning. The ball landed deep in center field and bounced over the fence. Cade whiffed a record 19 Amity batters, and gave up only three hits.

Drain started to the victory with a run in the second inning and then exploded a seven run burst in the next. Three singles loaded the sacks to start the big inning. Then Cade tripled, and the rout was underway.

Albany's Bud Gibbs scored the winning run that gave his team third place, while pitcher Bob Radford scattered the five hits he allowed Hillsboro. Biggs got aboard on a walk off Jim Nierman, went to third on one of three singles Nierman gave up in the game, and scored on a sacrifice.

Aumsville's Larry Brown hurled one-hit ball as his team rapped out 12 hits off the Union moundman for the class B third place. He fanned 13 and the lone hit was a single in the first inning.

O'Reilly Keeps Crown With Win Over Williams

Jack O'Reilly again successfully defended his Pacific Coast Junior Heavyweight title by holding popular Eddie Williams to a draw Saturday night at the armory.

After each had taken a fall, Williams had several chances to clamp on his specialty, the "highland fling," and did so about four times, but O'Reilly escaped through the ropes each time. Williams won the first fall in 33 long minutes with the fling. Referee Johnny Pavich tried to award Williams the match in the second fall because of too much dirty work on O'Reilly's part, but Williams refused, and soon O'Reilly clamped on his punishing hammerlock and won the fall. Williams couldn't catch up with him in the final fall, so the match ended in a draw, with O'Reilly keeping his title.

In the opener, Jack Kiser and Rod Fenton put on a match that almost had the main bout beat for thrills. In the first fall, Fenton, who incidentally was a wee bit on the dirty side, got the upper hand with a headlock and occasional punches to Kiser's nose. He apparently thought he had Kiser sufficiently groggy, so he let go of the headlock and bounced against the ropes, with intentions of a body slam. The first time Fenton bounced off, Kiser hit the floor, then Fenton hit the ropes on the other side of the ring and came at Kiser again. This time Kiser jumped clear over Fenton's head. The third time, Kiser met him with a flying dropkick on the button, jumped on him, and took the fall with a body press.

Fenton came back to take the second fall with a surboard after punching Kiser in the nose a few times, throwing him out of the ring, and knocking him to the mat with a wild swing to the head. In the third fall, referee Pavich got a little peeved at Fenton for his dirty tactics and encouraged Kiser to hit him back, so Kiser

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Phillies Win Three Games Over Giants

National League Lead Wrested From Dodgers; Yanks' Lead Is Shaved

Make one mistake against those hustlin' fightin' Phillies and it's your finish.

Ask the harried Leo Durocher or any of his luckless New York Giants. They'll tell you they should have won all four weekend games from Eddie Sawyer's whippersnappers from Philadelphia. But the boys from Philadelphia won three to New York's one.

As a result, the young and eager Phillies wrested the National league lead from the Brooklyn Dodgers. Deadlocked before yesterday's games, the Phils divided a pair with the Giants while Boston was beating the Brooks, 4-1. The Phils thus took undisputed possession of first place by half a game.

As in the victories Friday and Saturday, the Phils won yesterday's 11-inning 5-2 opener because they were quick to take advantage of a lapse by the opposition. Primarily because they played errorless ball, the Giants won the nightcap, 3-1, to end a seven-game losing streak.

Detroit shaved the New York Yankees' American league lead to two games by whipping the St. Louis Browns twice, 6-2 and 2-1, while the Philadelphia Athletics were halving a twin bill with the world champions. The A's came up with four runs in their final inning to win the second game, 6-5, after New York had won the opener, 6-3.

Washington shaved Boston into third place with a 7-6 triumph over the Red Sox. Cleveland and Chicago swapped shutouts. Steve Gromek blanking the White Sox, 7-0, after Bill Wight had stifled the Indians, 2-0, in the opener.

Chicago's Cubs took both ends of a doubleheader from Pittsburgh, 6-0 and 5-1, to sweep their four-game series. The third place St. Louis Cardinals whipped the Cincinnati Reds twice, 6-2 and 7-2, to climb within a game and a half of the top.

The home run played a big role for the Cards. After four-baggers by Tommy Glaviano and E. N. Slaughter had been instrumental in winning the opener for St.
