Ike Could Sweep GOP Convention, Rep. Scott Claims

PHILADELPHIA — (AP) — Rep. Hugh Scott (R-Pa.), former GOP national chairman, says that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower could

"sweep the convention" in 1952 if he consented to be a candidate for the Republican nomination for president.

Eisenhower, wartime supreme allied commander in Europe, and now President of Columbia university, declined to seek the nomination in 1948. He has since said repeatedly he does not seek the nomination.

Scott, a Philadelphian, said he and others in Congress had talked recently with Eisenhower in the opinion that not only GOP leaders but the "plain ordinary people" want him.

Scott said in an interview with the Evening Bulletin: "He is saying 'no' to everybody who sees him and that he genuinely feels that way."

"But he's a great soldier and a great man, and he might respond to a genuine appeal."

Frank Erickson, Gambler, Faces 60-Item Charge

NEW YORK — (AP) — A New York county grand jury has returned a 60-count information against Frank Erickson, gambler, who recently testified before a Senate investigation that he netted \$100,000 a year from gambling enterprises. He was charged with conspiracy and book-making.

The action was announced by District Attorney Frank S. Hogan. One count alleged conspiracy and the other 59 counts charge book-making.

The information charging book-making covers a 20-year period from 1930 to 1950, Hogan said.

The grand jury investigation followed Erickson's testimony before the Senate investigation. Erickson was sought for return of the papers without success.

Meanwhile, the New York jury has subpoenaed New Jersey bank records of Joe Adonis, underworld figure, his wife and son, Adonis is known as an associate of Erickson. The banks were ordered to give up the records by June 5 or show cause in court why they should not do so.

Conviction on the multi-count information carries a maximum penalty of a \$500 fine and one year in prison on each count.

The 54-year-old Erickson long has been the subject of official and unofficial inquiry. His arrest was once ordered by the late Mayor Fiorello H. LaGuardia "if he sticks his nose back in New York." The fiery little mayor also referred to Erickson as a "tinhorn punk."

The conspiracy count returned by the jury indicated that the bigtime gambler's activities were not confined to race track betting. The information mentioned baseball and basketball games "and other contests of skill, speed and power of endurance of men and beasts, and upon the results of other contingent events."

It also charged that Erickson's activities took place in New York, New Jersey and "elsewhere."

At his arraignment special sessions Justice Nathan D. Perlman set trial for June 12 and Erickson was paroled pending the posting of \$10,000 bail.

Erickson stood with eyes downcast and fiddled with his hat during the arraignment.

Hogan charged at the arraignment that Erickson accumulated a "tremendous fortune" as a result of gambling activities.

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Most GIs Have Insurance Money

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Just \$270,000,000 remains to be paid in national service life insurance dividends money to veterans and survivors in the first "special dividend" rebate.

That's not much when compared to the \$2,537,681,649 already paid. But it may take about as long to get rid of all of that \$270,000,000 as it has to distribute the billions already disbursed, because almost all of it involves what the Veterans administration calls "problem cases," most of which must be processed by hand.

A "problem case" could involve almost anything, but here are two major samples:

1. Suppose a veteran had three or four different serial numbers. The last three digits of a serial number determine how quickly each veteran gets his dividend. . . the lower the digits the quicker the payment.

2. Suppose a veteran applied for his dividend last fall but forgot to tell the VA where to send it.

That has happened and it means the VA must track him down and get an address for him. This could be tough if the veteran is a migratory worker, for instance.

But on veterans themselves, here is the 1st tally:

Checks have been mailed to just under 1,000,000 veterans. About 15,000 a day are going out now. Last January, when the paying

Garbage Trucker in Queen's Parade Restored To Job

BEBINGTON, Eng. — (AP) — The city council took pity on Sidney Cooper and gave him back the job he lost for driving his garbage truck in Queen Elizabeth's procession.

Cooper fell from grace May 3 when he maneuvered his bright orange garbage truck into the procession only three cars behind the Queen as she passed through here on her way to Birkenhead for a ship-launching ceremony.

The city health committee, which fired the 46-year-old driver last week, accused him of taking bows for cheers intended for the Queen. Cooper, father of eight, denied it. He said he just got caught in the traffic and couldn't get out.

Friends sent a petition signed by more than 1,000 persons to Buckingham palace asking the Queen to intervene on Cooper's behalf.

They say about 15,290,000 veterans are living today. But not all of them had national service life insurance. In fact, the VA says one tabulation shows that as many as eight percent of all servicemen never took out the insurance.

If the eight percent figure is accurate, it means that virtually all veterans have gotten their dividends.

Truck Loading Accident Basis Of Damage Suit

E. L. Settle has filed a suit in circuit court demanding a total of \$6,151.00 damages from Dennis Mathews and Roseburg transfer for alleged injuries received in a truck loading accident.

Settle charges in his complaint that the defendant was negligent in the operation of a truck that he was helping to load. The complaint alleges that Settle was helping to load sheep into the defendant's truck on July 31, 1948 when the defendant suddenly drove away jarring him severely while he was standing on the tailgate. The plaintiff charges that as a result of the accident he has suffered extreme mental and physical anguish.

Settle asks \$5,000 for general damages and \$1,151 special damage to cover his medical expenses.
