BOSTON — (AP) — The son of a navy commander killed aboard the aircraft carrier Wasp in the South Pacific in 1942 is taking his father's advice.
Just before he left for the Pacific, Commander John Joseph Shea wrote his only son:
"Be a good boy and grow up to be a good young man. Study hard when you go to school."
Get all the education you can."
Young Jackie Shea, of Arlington, now 13, has his choice of two high school scholarships.
An honor student for eight years at St. Agnes school in Arlington, he topped 400 other students recently to win a scholarship at Mattignon Catholic high school in nearby Cambridge.
In competition at Boston college, he finished ahead of 700 other youths. His average for the examination, in arithmetic and English, was 96.5 per cent.
Jackie's father was graduated from Boston college at the age of 19. He was the youngest member of the graduating class of 1918.

Senate Told U. S. Flier In Red Hands

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senator Knowland (R-Calif.) told the Senate Friday that Chinese Communists are holding Lawrence R. Buol, Stockton, Calif., civil aircraft pilot, as a prisoner of war and are giving him four hours daily "instruction in Communist principles."
Knowland made public a State department letter transmitting a report from the British consulate at Kunming on Buol. This said Buol apparently is getting good treatment.
Buol, a former Marine corps captain, was a pilot for the Chinese Civilian Air Transport, formerly operated by Gen. Claire Chennault. He was arrested by Chinese Communists when his plane went down in Communist territory Feb. 15.
The British consulate general at Kunming reported that the Chinese said Buol was held "as a prisoner of war and that therefore his American citizenship cannot be recognized."

The consul was advised, however, that Buol was "receiving the best food available, that he was playing basketball and that he was daily receiving four hours instruction in Communist principles." Buol has been permitted to communicate directly with his wife, the British report said.
Knowland said also that nine other Americans were being held "for extortion" by the Chinese Communists. He said they were being refused exit visas until they would guarantee life pensions—at full wages—to former Chinese employees.

German Athletes Flee From Red-Ruled Zone

BERLIN, June 6 — (AP) — Two football teams and two rowing clubs turned up in West Berlin today as the latest refugees from Russian-occupied east Germany.
One of the football teams came all the way from Dresden in southern Saxony. The 12 men also brought their wives with them. The players said they objected to the communization of sport in the Soviet zone which forced their private club to accept sponsorship from a nationalized industry.
Under this system private clubs must wear the colors of a "people's owned" enterprise or face dissolution.
The oarsmen had the same complaint.

Safeway Defers Expansion Plans, Blames Strikes

SAN FRANCISCO, June 3 — (AP) — Safeway stores have indefinitely postponed a \$20,000,000 improvement program for San Francisco and Oakland, Linan A. Warren, company president, said today.

Warren said the decision was made by Safeway directors because of the protracted AFL grocery clerks' strike in the two cities. The directors, he said, also withheld decision on a similar program of approximately \$10,000,000 in Fresno and Sacramento, and in San Mateo and Santa Clara counties, where the union has threatened to extend the strike.

Informed of Safeway's announcement, a union spokesman charged the corporation was "trying to punish the people of San Francisco and Oakland for supporting the clerks' union in their fight for contract protection."

The strike, which began over whether store managers should be represented by the union, has closed down San Francisco stores since mid-January. Alameda and Contra Costa county stores have been picketed since last fall but have continued operating.

Tornado Rakes Texas Towns; 8 Persons Hurt

KENNY, Texas, June 6 — (AP) — A house-wrecking tornado raged across three southern Texas counties late yesterday, injuring at least eight persons and scattering buildings around in two villages.
Gales, estimated at 70 miles an hour, whirled about the twister as it roared through Kenny in Austin county, Klump in Washington county, and the Raccoon bend oil field. The winds swept on in an arc hitting Patton, Brookshire and Katy in southern Waller county.
