NEW YORK, June 7.—Mrs. Edward S. Harkness, 75, widow of the financier whose philanthropies exceeded \$120,000,000 died yesterday at her home here.

She and Harkness, a son of Stephen V. Harkness, one of the founders of the Standard Oil company, were married in 1904. They had no children. Like her husband, Mrs. Harkness was a retiring giver. She was closely associated with him in planning many of the benefactions and

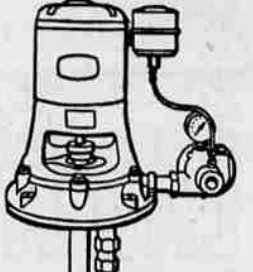

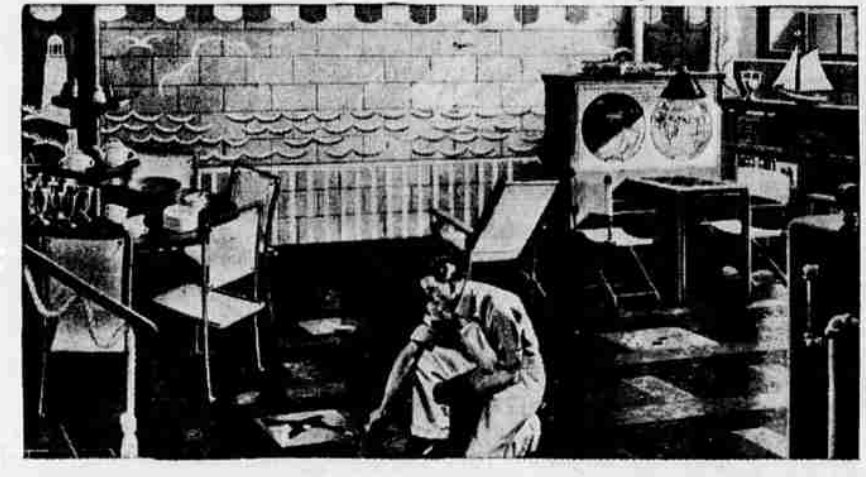
