Weyerhaeuser Strike's Ending Chances Are Slim

TACOMA, June 7 — (AP) — Weyerhaeuser Timber company indicated today it saw no hope of a settlement of an international settlement of an international Woodworkers of America (IWA) strike against seven of its branches in Oregon and Washington.

"There appears to be no basis for a prompt settlement . . . despite the fact the company has made two substantial offers. . . . It also appears, in view of the union's rigid opposition to both of these proposals, that no basis exists at this time for a meeting in the near future," the company said.

The statement, contained in a letter addressed to all striking members of the IWA, pointed out that the company had originally offered a pension plan, health and welfare benefits and three paid holidays. The second offer was for a 10 1/2-cent-per-hour wage increase. The union has continued its demands for a union shop 7 1/2-cent health and welfare program and three paid holidays.

"The company is unchanged in its belief that the union's health and welfare program is neither legal nor practical, and that a union shop is not in the best interest of the employees or the company," the Weyerhaeuser statement explained.

As estimated 9,000 men have been jobless since the IWA struck May 15.

Oregon Heads List G. O. P. Principles

PORTLAND, June 7 — (AP) — A statement of republican party principles was released yesterday by the state central committee. It championed the argument that "no government — local, state or federal — should do for free people what free people can do for themselves."

It pledged support to the so-called balanced plan for legislative reapportionment favored by revision of state government for efficiency and economy and continuation of the veterans' loan program by the state.

Chairman Sigrid Unander listed these other major points: 1—Any tax increase should be specifically approved by the people; 2—a balance must be struck between the rights and responsibilities of labor and business; 3—Worker welfare needs improvement, particularly for those with dependents; 4—The seasonality clause of the unemployment compensation law should be amended to eliminate any injustice caused by the 1949 act.
