

Salaries Of Northwest Methodist Ministers Upped

TACOMA, June 10 — (P) — The Pacific Northwest conference of the Methodist church Friday adopted a minimum salary schedule for ministers and supply pastors — those who serve the conference but don't belong. Pay of full-time married ministers was raised from \$2,000 to \$2,200 and single ministers, full-time, were boosted from \$1,800 to \$2,000 with quarters. Married supply pastors' salaries were set at \$2,000 and lodging and single supply pastors at \$1,800 and quarters. There had been no previous minimum in this classification.

Birth In Russia Concealed By Lie, U. S. Jury Charges

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9 — (P) — A 38-year-old woman biochemist at Stanford university today is charged by a federal indictment with lying to immigration officials to conceal her Russian birth.

She is Dr. Bertha Barkan Luthy, wife of a Jackson, Mich., spark plug manufacturer.

The grand jury indictment charges that Dr. Luthy lied when she told an immigration inspector at Palo Alto last Feb. 13 that she was born in Chicago Oct. 4, 1916. The immigration service maintains she was born in the Russian Ukraine in 1912 and entered the United States through Seattle in 1917 with her mother.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Edgar Bonsall said her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Yankel Barkan, residing in Jackson, Mich., under the name of James Barker, are awaiting a rehearing on an immigration service deportation order for assertedly advocating violent overthrow of the government.

Dr. Philip Leighton, head of the Stanford university chemistry department, said Dr. Luthy is engaged in cancer research on grant from the Rockefeller foundation.

The research assistant's work has no connection with projects classified as secret or confidential.

Thieves Choosy In Looting Museum

PITTSBURGH, — (P) — Thieves passed up a group of fans once owned by Marie Antoinette but stole 23 other "historically valuable" objects from the Carnegie institute museum.

Wallace Richards, museum director, said that the robbers apparently remained in the museum after the closing time.

The things taken were from the museum's Dupuy collection — do-

nated by Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Dupuy. He was a business associate of steel magnate Andrew Carnegie.

The items taken included an enameled pill box, needle case, watch fob and six dance card cases. Richards said the thieves made their selections carefully, passing by some objects to take others. They overlooked some valuable treasures, including the Marie Antoinette fans.


Richards said the value of the missing objects "could not be estimated."

Bonsall said a warrant has been issued for Dr. Luthy's arrest and bail has been set at \$1,000. Conviction on the charge carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$2,000 fine.
