

Navy Commander Reports On Soviet A-Bomb Strength

NEW YORK—(AP)—Reports that Russia may have six atom bombs on hand by next fall, and soon may be producing them at the rate of 25 a year, were quoted by a military expert here.

The expert, Navy Commander William T. Greenhalgh said other authorities may have other ideas on the matter. He offered no conclusion of his own.

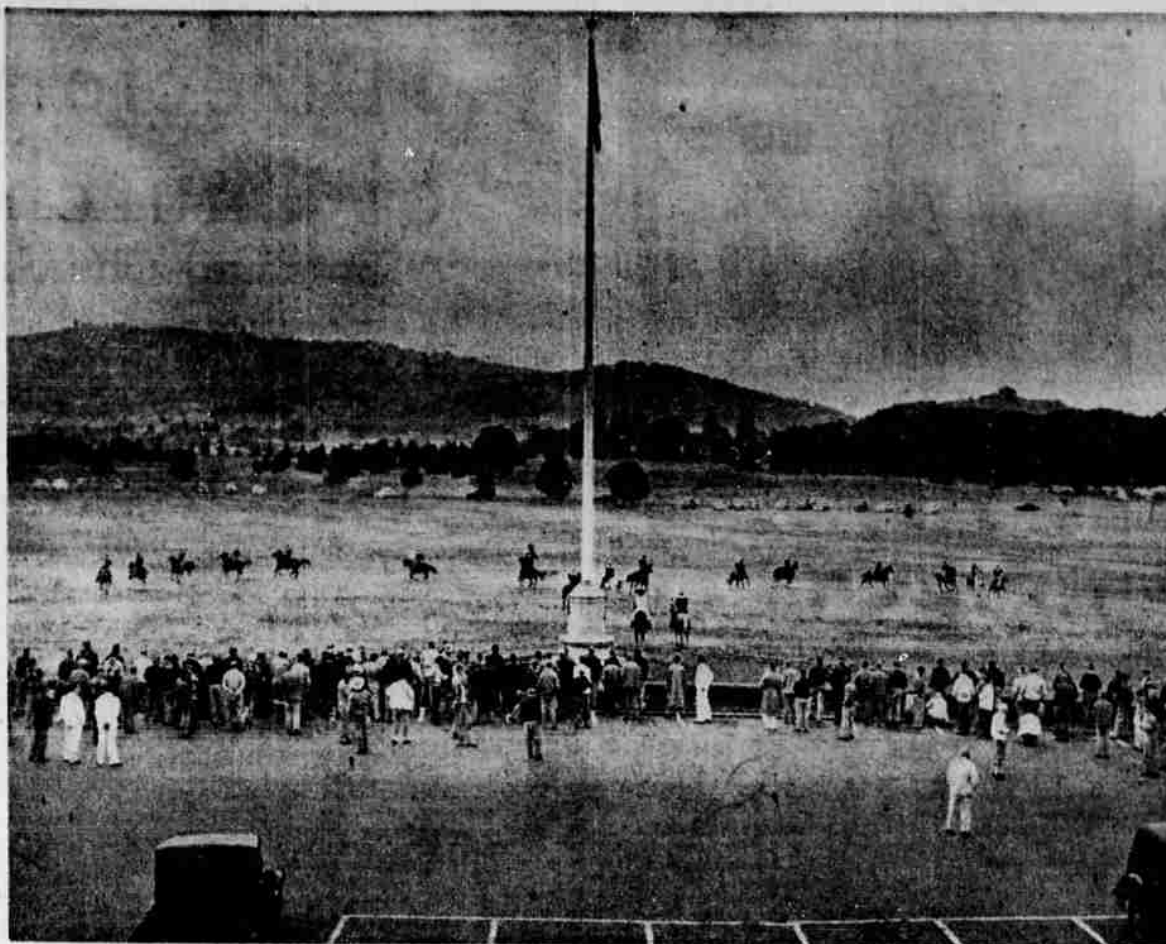
"The Soviets cannot keep their secrets forever, although they are past masters in the art of hiding and delaying facts about themselves," he said.

Greenhalgh said Soviet aviators who fled Russia have told of 44 air fields in east Siberia—a likely takeoff point for an attack on the U.S.A. Northwest.

Russia, he said, may have 19,000 war planes capable of use in combat, plus a reserve of 10,000. The Soviet factories might be able to turn out 60,000 aircraft a year if necessary arose, he said.

He estimated the Russian fighters are turning out about 200 jet fighters a month and about 20 bombers.

The Navy officers said Russia's guided missile and rocket program is about equal to America's. He said the Red army has 40,000 tanks

Gilbert's attorney suggested to Judge Michael A. Musmanno that Gilbert be allowed to pay \$50 each month to the Pennsylvania Heart association for the next year instead of going to jail. Musmanno agreed.

COWBOY IS SUICIDE

PENDLETON, June 16.—(AP)—A 58-year-old cowboy, Albert Wilkenson, committed suicide above Bingham Springs Thursday, Coroner Allen Folsom reported.

His body was found by a co-worker for the Weston Cattleman's association. Wilkenson left a note telling where to find the horses. Evidence showed that he had leaped over the muzzle of a 32-caliber rifle and pulled the trigger.

Cause of his despondency was not known.

Colds Of Students Reduced By Designs Of Schools

BELLFLOWER, Calif.—(AP)—School absences due to colds can be reduced by modern design and heating of school buildings, says Dr. Norman Wampler, superintendent of schools here. He credits them with effecting a 14 percent cut in such absences among children in a new kindergarten.

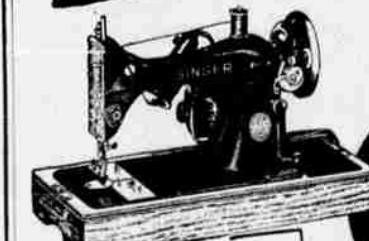
A special detail of 38 policemen has taken up new posts in the loop. Their job—to last until the fair closes on Labor day—will be to chase the bums out of the city.

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Grangers Oppose Brannan Program

EVERETT, June 16.—(AP)—Delegates to the state grange convention Thursday rejected almost unanimously a resolution calling for support of the Brannan farm plan. The convention adopted another program favoring a long-range farm program providing 100 percent parity prices on domestic market consumption.

The Brannan plan measure was speedily rejected after being called "impossible" although there was no debate.

The approved resolution recommended that the state grangers ask for a farm administrative board; protection for family size farms; a two-price system subsidy program and commodity credit corporation loans on both raw and processed storable commodities.

The Grangers included fruit, dairy products and meat in the proposed price support plan but only until a more satisfactory program could be worked out for those items.

The convention also adopted a resolution generally opposing subsidization and the existing federal price support plan an "un-American and contrary to the best American principles."

LOS ANGELES, June 16.—(AP)—Police have been called in to aid private detectives in the search for opera singer Anna Cuyler, 52.

Her mother, Mrs. Ella L. Thompson, 86, reported that her daughter, whose real name is Dorothy, was seen May 29 at a Pasadena hotel. She said her daughter told her she feared Communists and that she had been moving from one hotel to another in recent months to avoid unknown enemies.
