Rural Highway Mishap Death Toll Still Heavy

SALEM, 17 — (AP) — Rural highway accidents continued to take a deadly toll in Oregon last year, secretary of state Newberry reports.

Seventy-seven percent of Oregon's highway deaths occurred on rural roads, although only 28 percent of the accidents occurred in such areas.

The speed at which most open-highway mishaps take place is blamed for the topheavy death percentage.

More traffic fatalities occurred among Sunday drivers than those who drive on week days, it was revealed.

Sixty-seven of Oregon's traffic fatalities occurred on Sunday last year. Saturday ran second with 60 fatalities. Tuesday had the least number of deaths, with 25.

Setting Gander Posing Problem In Starving

MICHIGAN CITY, Ind., June 17 — (AP) —How does one go about slipping a couple of goslings under a setting gander?

Attendants at the privately-owned International Friendship gardens are faced with that problem. Gus, their six-year-old gander, may starve if some such drastic action isn't taken.

For two weeks Gus has warmed eggs containing what now appear to be one-dozen gone goslings. He refuses to eat until the eggs hatch. The apparently fruitless task was given up by his mates, Clara and Dora, after alternating a four week setting session, past the normal incubation period.

When the gals vacated the nest, Gus ceased both strutting and blunting and crawled aboard. Attendants think if they can sneak in a couple of baby geese Gus may be content with its efforts and quit his hunger strike.

Job Office Here Becoming Center For Breadwinners

If it's anything about jobs, the local employment office knows about it. And since a person's main interest from 18 to 80 is work of some sort or another, it's only natural that the local office is rapidly becoming the community center for all activities having to do with bread-winning.

As a living directory of training agencies, the local office directs the youth just out of high school or fresh from the farm to a vocational school, apprentice shop or business college. Counseling is specially important at this age, and a change in occupation can be guided most effectively by reason of this knowledge of training agencies—along with the detailed data concerning industrial or trade development of the area that will bring later employment. On-the-job training fits in with this program.

Or it may be a civil service career that appeals to the person just starting out—or who hasn't yet found his or her niche in the economic world. If so, the local office can put its finger on the appropriate federal, state or local branch of government offering appropriate opportunities. And here again more training or experience may be indicated.

During summer-time or vacation periods the employment office often is the busiest place in town. Issuance of work permits to minors, social security cards, seasonal work—all these and many other matters either can be handled by employment deputies, or they can direct the inquirer to the correct agency.

Sea Scouts Save Three From Lake

KLAMATH FALLS, June 17 — (AP) —Two sea scouts rescued three youngsters and their dog from the choppy waters of upper Klamath Lake Thursday.

Angus and Sara Stewart, Frances Stearns and the Stewart cocker, "Duncan," were sailing in the Stewart snipe "Augusta Wind" when a gust of wind overturned the craft and tossed the occupants into the water.

Two sea scouts, John Yantis and Robert French, were watching from shore half a mile away and saw the boat go over. They rode their motor scooters to a dock where a small scout boat was moored, hopped aboard and sailed out to the overturned craft.

About the same time workers at a sawmill on the lakeshore spotted the overturned boat and set out in a company craft. But the sea scouts won the rescue race and took the Stewart children, Frances and Duncan aboard. The three had climbed upon their capsized boat to await rescue.

Duncan, who spent most of his time in the water, suffered the only ill effects. Friday morning he was unable to bark.

Plane Crashes Residence; Nobody Seriously Hurt

PORTLAND, June 17 — (AP) —A small plane crashed into a south-east Portland residence early Friday, but no one was seriously hurt.

Glen Grantham, 46, the pilot, and Esther Osterbach, 30, a passenger, were treated for minor injuries.

Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Pugh and their 10-month-old son, asleep in a bedroom only ten feet from the spot where the plane slammed into the house, escaped injury.

Grantham said the motor failed as he was preparing to land the plane at Troh's skyport. The craft smashed a living room window, then careened off the side of the house and knocked a garage from its foundation.

Grantham told sheriff's deputy.
