Columbia River Diversion Idea 'Mostly Just Talk'

SEATTLE — (AP) — A member of President Truman's water resources policy commission says channeling Columbia river waters more than 1,000 miles to America's water-starved areas is a "highly dramatic idea, but mostly just talk."

Dr. Roland R. Renne, president of Montana State college, added that Columbia river water gives less promise of solving California's water shortage than the waters of the Pacific ocean.

The educator held out little hope of using ocean water soon, but regards it as a more practical long-range aim than divergence of Columbia river streams. He said: "The influential people of California don't think the Columbia river idea is feasible. They believe they can find closer and more reasonable sources of supply."
