CLEVELAND, June 21 —(AP)—Charles Nance, 30, who made good a threat of throat-slitting if his companion said even "boo," was headed for Mansfield reformatory today on a one to 20-year sentence.

Bartender Wilbur Foy testified in court yesterday that the companion, Leo Green, 41, who had lived at the same Cleveland address as Nance, did say "boo."

Then, added Foy, Nance knifed the throat of Green, who died minutes later.

A jury brought in a conviction on a first degree manslaughter charge.

Foy recalled the argument started after Green played "My Mama Done Told Me" 30 times on a juke box.

**Insurance Sought In Court Action**

A suit has been filed in circuit court for Roger Cooper demanding \$1200 judgment allegedly due under terms of an insurance policy issued by the United Pacific Insurance Co.

Cooper allegedly received a personal injury which caused his death on Feb. 24, 1949. He was insured at the time of the accident by the defendant corporation, who refused to honor the plaintiff's claim.

A. W. Bashford, doing business as Douglas County Flour Mill, has filed suit against Albert D. Hill and Lura M. Hill asking judgment for \$509.16 allegedly due on a promissory note.

Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly has awarded a judgment for the plaintiffs, J. W. Reed and Rose Reed, in a suit against Ethel L. Martin, Arno J. Melchior, Bertha M. Melchior and Henry Shirliff. The involved sum is for \$6,708.49, allegedly due on a mortgage. The court ordered the mortgage foreclosed if the judgment is not paid within 30 days.

**Budworm Target Of Planes In Eastern Oregon Area**

SALEM, —(AP)—An armada of planes have begun in the Heppner area to spray thousands of acres of the state's timberlands. The target is the spruce budworm.

From 20 to 30 take-offs and landings each hour will take place at some of the airstrips in the Heppner-La Grande Area. John B. Woods Jr., forester in charge of the undertaking reported.

The planes fly from 75 to 200 feet above the solid blocks of timber, spraying DDT to control the budworm. George Spaur, state forester, reports. Near 450,000 acres of forests are due to pass under the low-flying planes before the million dollar project is completed.
