MILWAUKEE. — (P) — A plea for continued efforts toward unity among all Lutherans was made to the 873 delegates representing 5,566 parishes in the United States and Canada at the 41st triennial convention of the Lutheran church-Missouri synod here.

Dr. John W. Behnken, president of the Synod, declared the or-ganization will renew its attempts to encourage "free' conferences among clergy and laity of all Lutheran bodies in the nation to discuss unity.


