

Springfield, Central Point Face Financial Gaps
(By the Associated Press)
For the second time two Oregon cities have turned down budget requests and perplexed officials are wondering how they will run their cities.

At Springfield, the voters on May 19 rejected a \$99,000 budget over the 6 per cent limitation. That amount was scaled down to \$87,000 and Friday the voters rejected it again, 434 to 404.

Drastic cuts in planned services for the rapidly expanding city are foreseen.

At Central Point the story was the same. The total budget was only \$28,135, about \$8,000 less than this year. The voters were asked to okay \$4,513 over the 6 per cent. Their adverse vote on June 5 was 79-77. Friday it was 112 to 109. City Recorder Arden Pinkham said he couldn't understand it: There was no vocal opposition.

Contact C. Of C. If Census Overlooked You

Harold Hickerson, Roseburg chamber of commerce secretary-manager, issued a plea today to all city residents who were not counted in the 1950 census to contact his office.

Not convinced by the preliminary report from the Bureau of Census that Roseburg's population is a mere 8,205, chamber of commerce and city officials have continued checking in an effort to locate persons who were not counted. Hickerson said "at least 50 persons" have already indicated they were not included in the city's population count.

On the present basis of allotting state funds to the city, each additional person added to Roseburg's final census count will increase the city's income by \$6.25.

Bus Windows Smashed In Portland Labor Row

PORTLAND, June 23. — (AP) — A flare-up of violence in the Portland stages' labor dispute was on record today, after the company's manager asked the sheriff for protection along bus routes.

E. G. Larson told Sheriff Terry Schruk that people had tossed rocks and baton bearings through the windows of buses, which are now being manned by non-union drivers.

The sheriff called Harold T. Oathes, business agent of the striking union, who said the union would not countenance any violence.

Goldy Faces Criticism
On O-C Land Policies

MEDFORD, June 23 — (AP) — Daniel L. Goldy, regional administrator of the bureau of land management, was slated to explain the new right-of-way ruled to lumbermen here today, with criticism expected.

The criticism started yesterday at an O. & C. advisory board meeting, when board member Floyd Hart called the new regulations "inequitable, inadequate, and unworkable."

The regulations apply to access roads into government timber, and were announced recently in Washington, D. C. They do not follow all the recommendations of the advisory board here.

The board heard District Forester E. K. Peterson predict that timber from O. & C. lands in this area would total 90,000,000 board feet next year.

PEARSON BACKS FLEGE

SALEM, — (AP) — State treasurer Walter Pearson told Marion county Democrats here he is "one hundred percent behind Austin Flegel in his bid for the governorship of Oregon."

Pearson spoke, along with Flegel, at a reorganization meeting of the county Democratic central committee.

Pearson was one of Flegel's opponents for the Democratic gubernatorial candidacy in the May 19 primary.
