Repayment Record Good On Loans To War Vets

PORTLAND, (AP)—More than \$72,000,000 has been loaned to Oregon World War II veterans during the six years of the GI bill, the veterans administration reported.

A total of 14,500 veterans applied for the loans. Most of them—85 percent—were for purchasing homes.

Only seven-tenths of 1 percent of all the loans have been defaulted.

BRITAIN TO CONTINUE—LONDON, June 23.—(AP)—The British government proposed to give this country's farmers another 8,000,000 pounds (\$22,400,000) a year in subsidies for fertilizers and gasoline driven machinery.

The fertilizer subsidy of 5,000,000 pounds (\$14,000,000) a year would last for three years under the terms of a bill introduced and published.

Grants for "agricultural petrol driven machines" were estimated at 3,000,000 (\$8,400,000) a year for an indefinite period.

## Romance Rumor Links Princess Margaret, Scot

LONDON — (AP)—London gossip is saying that Princess Margaret wants to marry the 36-year-old Earl of Dalketh, Buckingham palace, which frowns on such talk, refuses to discuss it.

The rumors have it that the engagement of Princess Elizabeth's younger sister will be announced after Margaret's 20th birthday, Aug. 21.

The earl himself, a handsome, red-haired Scotsman who has been one of Margaret's most devoted escorts, snorted impatiently and called the rumors "foolish."

"The number of times I have escorted the princess is irrelevant," the earl said.

The earl, son of the Duke of Buccleuch, was Margaret's escort last week when the royal family rode to the royal Ascot race meeting in an open carriage. He was a guest at the royal house party at Windsor during the week.

Margaret and the earl have been friends since childhood. Their association has a family link in the fact that Margaret's aunt, the Duchess of Gloucester, is a sister of the earl's father, and thus the earl's aunt too.

The young six-foot-tall earl keeps busy managing his father's vast estates, which he some day will inherit. The estates cover some 500,000 acres in seven counties and the fortune is one of Britain's greatest.

GI Receives Permit To Bring Jap Wife To U. S.

WASHINGTON — (AP)—Legislation permitting John K. Stevenson of Portland, Ore., to bring his Japanese wife and their son to this country for permanent residence has been signed by President Truman.

Stevenson, serving in the army of occupation, asked for the legislation to permit him to bring his family to this country when his enlistment expires in September.
