

Nut Imports Peril Home Market, Angell Declares

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Rep. Angell (R-Ore.) has protested to secretary of state Acheson that imports of filberts and other nuts are driving American producers out of the market.

Angell made public a letter urging Acheson to take a stand against any further reductions in the duty on nuts at the tariff negotiations in England next fall.

Angell said in a statement that he has protested to the state department, the tariff commission and the Economic Cooperation administration.

Loyalty Probes, Oaths Attacked

PORTLAND—(AP)—Loyalty oaths and loyalty probes—as presently constituted—came in for criticism

from Patrick Malin, new executive director of the American Civil Liberties union, who spoke here.

Malin, a Quaker, said he considered congressional investigations necessary, to curb espionage, sabotage, and "reachery."

"But it is equally important," he added, "to keep alive the habits of free expression and a fair trial."

He criticized the present congressional loyalty probe for providing no way in which an accused man can face his accuser or defend himself.

"Congress," said Malin, "ought to exercise self-restraint in protecting names of people until proven guilty."

Loyalty oaths, he declared, "are ineffective in ferreting out the real subversive, because he lies. He doesn't feel the fear of heavenly perjury, and earthly perjury is all in the day's work."

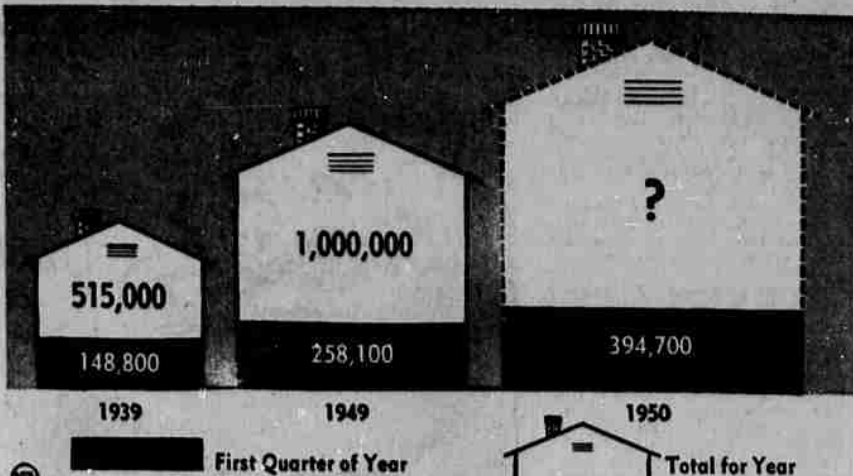

This year's tremendous house-building boom has already resulted in rising costs and higher prices for finished homes.
