Prominent Oregonians in Korean War Zone

PORTLAND, June 27.—(AP)—Stanley Earl, former secretary-treasurer of the Oregon CIO, is among Oregonians who may be in the Korean war zone.

Earl, 39, left here last September to become assistant economic administrator for ECA in Korea, specializing in labor problems.

Dr. Harold J. Noble, former University of Oregon professor, is believed to be with the American embassy in Seoul.

Others, all from Portland, reported in Korea were: Viva Leona Anderson, educational director for American forces in Korea; Dr. Edward Chuck, former political science professor at Lewis and Clark college, now teaching at Seoul university; Capt. and Mrs. K. F. Peterson and their two children.

J. N. Hamlin Is Sent To Post In Ecuador

WASHINGTON, June 27.—The state department has announced assignment of John Nellis Hamlin, foreign service officer from Portland, to Ecuador as first secretary and consul at the United States embassy in Quito.

Hamlin has been stationed in Singapore as United States consul. He is a native of Roseburg, but moved as a youth to Portland, where he attended high school before going to the University of Oregon.

He left the university to enter the army during World War I. He was commissioned in the foreign service in 1924 and has since served in Tirana, Albania; Buenos Aires, Naples, Washington, Seville and Singapore.
