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Kidnap Suspect Ex-Wife Sought After Slaying

KLAMATH FALLS, June 28 — (AP)—A 26-year-old Redmond man is sought today over southeastern Oregon in connection with a shooting and alleged kidnaping at Sprague River last night. He is Cleo Parks, believed to be armed with a 30-30 calibre rifle. District Attorney D. E. Van Vactor said Parks last night went to the ranch home of his ex-wife, Mrs. Doris Williams, and demanded that she give him their 18-month-old baby. The girl refused and Parks left.

Twenty minutes later, the district attorney said, a ranch hand, but a ranch hand, Ray Scott, had come into the house and he refused to allow Parks to come in. Then, according to Van Vactor's reconstruction of events, Parks broke the glass out of a kitchen door and fired one shot into the house.

The slug struck Scott, tearing off his right arm at the elbow and passing through his chest. When help from neighboring ranches arrived, Scott, still conscious, said Parks chased Mrs. Williams out of the house and into the darkness after the shooting. State police and sheriff's officers searched the Indian reservation area around Sprague river through the night without locating either Parks or the 20-year-old girl. Sheriff Jack Franey said Parks probably had a car and may have driven back toward Lakeview and Redmond, forcing the girl to accompany him.

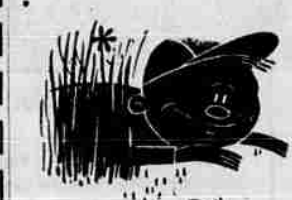
Scott, aged 25, is in a critical condition at a hospital here.

Fake Traffic Officer Reaches End Of Racket

CHICAGO, June 28 — (AP)—A house painter told police yesterday he had made a nice little profit out of threatening motorists with arrests for traffic violations.

He might still be in the business if he had not tried to put the pinch on a real policeman. The painter gave his name as Gene Ostrin, 41. Police Lt. Edward Lefevour said Ostrin tried to arrest him for speeding, and displayed a pad of long obsolete traffic tickets. Ostrin also flashed a stolen policeman's badge.

Lefevour said Ostrin told him he had taken about \$400 from 150 motorists under threats of arrest since April 1. He was charged with impersonating an officer and larceny of the badge.



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Substitutes Threaten Lumber Trade, Society Is Told

PORTLAND —(AP)—The lumber industry was told it is neglecting product improvement and might lose out to substitutes.

J. B. Grantham of the Oregon State college school of forestry, told the International Forest Research society that only a few class A mills are aware of this. Progressive lumber manufacturers, he said, may spend a half a cent of every sales dollar on product improvement. At the same time, a plaster board manufacturer may spend up to 10 cents per sales dollar on development work and sales improvement.

He said the West Coast Lumbermen's association is doing an increasingly good job of trade promotion.

A Canadian, F. W. Guernsey, engineer for forest products laboratories of Canada, Vancouver, B.C., told the researchers that overcutting of virgin forests makes full utilization imperative. There is a

world shortage of wood and pulp products, he said.
