Family Heav Perishes As Fire Destroys Home

DELENA, Ore. (Columbia County), July 7 — (P) — Burns suffered in a stove explosion Wednesday night were fatal early today to Timothy Dicken, 50.

The family home was destroyed. Mrs. Dicken and a seven-year-old son, Lavern, who received minor burns, are in the Longview, Wash., hospital where Dicken died.

Four other children escaped the flaming home. Dale, a high school student, was burned slightly in dragging his father from the house and beating out the flames on his clothing.

The explosion occurred mysteriously as Dicken poured what he thought was only coal on the fire in the stove.
