Accused Man Flops In Role Of Own Attorney

UPPER MERLBORO, Md., July 8 —(P)—Ronald Harris is back in a Maryland penitentiary cell today after a brief fling as a lawyer.

Harris was let out long enough yesterday to represent himself.

He's going to have to stand trial in October on a charge of robbing a filling station attendant six years ago. He's now serving time for auto theft.

The middle-aged convict threw a string of motions at Judge Charles C. Marbury to dismiss the indictment, change the scene of the trial, subpoena witnesses from the pen and to represent himself.

The judge dismissed all but the last.

Asked if he had any more, Harris replied: "No, but I'll have some — don't worry about that. I like filing motions."

Italians Want To Aid U. S. Forces In Korea
ROME, July 8 —(P)—Italians are volunteering in person and by mail for service in Korea with the American forces. U. S. embassy sources said today.

At least 30 personal applications have been received. Others have written the embassy asking how they can get into the fight.

The embassy press office said that it knew of no provision thus far for accepting foreign enlistments.
