NOTICE

Notice is given that The California Oregon Power Company, a California corporation, whose address is Medford, Oregon, has filed with the Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon an application to appropriate waters of the State of Oregon, in a stream known as Fish Creek, a tributary of North Umpqua River, for the development of a power project designated on the records of the Commission as Project No. 20 and by the applicant as the Fish Creek project.

The applicant proposes to appropriate 150 cubic feet per second of water from Fish Creek and divert the same, by means of a concrete dam approximately 35 feet high located in the SE 1/4 of Section 14 and the NE 1/4 of Section 23, Township 27 South, Range 3 East, W. 4, through a canal and timber flume about 3 miles long to a turbine connected to a generator of 11,000 kilowatts located in the SW 1/4 of Section 27, Township 28 South, Range 3 East, W. 4.

The applicant proposes to install a suitable fishway in the diversion dam and to bypass a minimum of 10 cubic feet per second through the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given to all persons that the Hydroelectric Commission of Oregon, will hold a public hearing on said application for a license of use of the waters of the State of Oregon, on the 21st day of July, 1950, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock p.m., Pasco Standard Time (3:00 o'clock a.m., Daylight Saving Time) at the office of the Commission in the City of Salem, Marion County, Oregon, to consider all protests or remonstrances on behalf of the public or any corporation or district organized for public purposes or of any other person or persons.

All objections, protests or remonstrances to the granting of such license shall be made in writing and based on the grounds set forth in Title 119, Chapter 1, O.C.L.A., as amended, and filed with the Secretary of the undersigned Commission at Salem, Oregon, on or before July 24, 1950. A certified copy thereof upon the application by the protestant on or before July 24, 1950, and proof of such service shall be furnished the Commission.

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Centennial Event, Rodeo Held At Yoncalla On 4th

The centennial celebration and rodeo, held in Yoncalla July 2, 3 and 4 drew one of the largest crowds in the history of the town.

The celebration started Sunday morning, July 2, with a joint church service of the Yoncalla Church of Christ and the Yoncalla Methodist group held in the grade school gym. The combined choirs furnished special music and both Rev. Byars of the Methodist church and Rev. Smith of the Church of Christ delivered short sermons on "Pioneering in Christianity." The stage of the gym was decorated with red, white and blue crepe paper and bouquets of flowers.

On Monday, old homecoming day, a short program was enjoyed in the grade school gym. Mayor Blickenstaff gave the address of welcome, relating a short resume of Yoncalla's last 100 years, from prairie schooners up to the present day "flying saucers." Mrs. Mary Dickenson Crow, the oldest living native born citizen of Yoncalla, was given the honor title of Centennial Queen. She was presented with a huge bouquet of flowers by Rev. Byars. Mrs. Crow is the granddaughter of Spencer Dickenson, pioneer judge of the early Umpqua county.

The remainder of the day was spent reviewing the antiques in store windows and in the corner store, where spinning wheels, Indian relics, antique dishes, cooking utensils, quilts, candle molds, oxen yokes, ancient Bibles and other relics were on display. Another drawing card was the open house, held by Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Applegate, who now occupy the old Charles Applegate home northeast of Yoncalla. Arriving from Portland to assist in this 95-year-old home were Mr. and Mrs. Ray Tuley and Miss Eva Applegate of Portland.

A baseball game between Yoncalla and Oakland was played during the afternoon, with Oakland winning. In the evening, the Yoncalla Lions club, dressed in women's clothes, played a softball game with the Drain Lions club. The money raised by this game will provide transportation for the children of Yoncalla to go to the Drain swimming pool during the warm days.

One of the finest parades ever seen in Yoncalla was held Fourth of July morning. Yoncalla outdid itself in floats, with most of the merchants participating. Dickey's service center provided two colorful floats, one showing the modern

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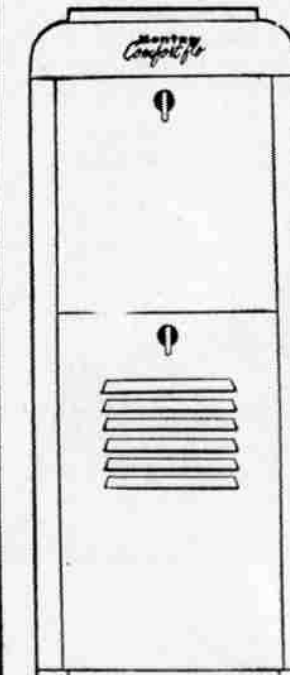
