

Traffic Charge Jails Driver In Default Of Fine

Floyd Smith of Centralia, Wash., pleaded guilty in justice court to a charge of failure to leave his name and address at the scene of an accident. Justice of the Peace A. J. Geddes reported.

He is now being held in the county jail in lieu of payment of a \$100 fine.

Smith was arrested Tuesday by city police on a private complaint signed by Horace (Dick) Debernardi, following an accident in which Smith's car struck Debernardi's car and another owned by an unidentified Californian, according to Police Chief Calvin H. Baird. Debernardi's vehicle was damaged to the extent of \$40 to \$50, Baird said. Damage to the California car was not learned.

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Drunken Driver, Auto Companion Are Fined

A fine of \$225 and a sentence of 30 days in the county jail were imposed on Jetty Thom, 35, of Yreka, Calif., on a drunken driving charge according to Justice of the Peace A. J. Geddes. Thom was arrested by the state police.

Arrested with Thom was Anderson Charlie, 33, also of Yreka, who was fined \$50 on a charge of drunkenness on a public highway, re-reported Justice Geddes.
