

Berry Prices Fixed By Cane Fruits Control Board

SALEM — (AP)—The price of loganberries, youngberries and boysenberries to canneries and freezing plants will be 8½ cents a pound, directors of the Oregon cane fruits control board decided at a meeting at Woodburn.

The price last year was 6 cents a pound.

The board generally fixes the prices for the berries, although some growers sometimes charge varying prices.

On June 26, the board decided to charge the canneries and freezing plants 10 cents a pound for the loganberries, but lower California prices forced the directors to cut the price to 8½ cents, William J. Linfoot, secretary-treasurer of the board, said.

Linfoot said the price for youngberries and boysenberries was the first established for this year.

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Oregon Electrical Code Held Void In Grants Pass Case

GRANTS PASS, Oregon's electrical code is unconstitutional, Circuit Judge O. J. Millard ruled here in the case of Eugene R. O'Brien vs. Samuel J. Miller, electrical contractor, Cave Junction.

The court ruled that the Oregon legislature's adoption of the "national electrical code" was an unconstitutional delegation of authority. Decisions on a similar issue in other states have been conflicting.

The court's ruling was on a motion of attorneys for Pacific Indemnity company, with whom the defendant is insured.

Brown sued Miller for \$27,500 as the result of a fire which destroyed the Brown home Christmas day, 1948, alleging defective wiring. The defendant claimed compliance with the state's electrical code.

PORTLAND, —(AP)—The court decision at Grants Pass holding the state's electrical code unconstitutional, will be called immediately to the attention of the commissioner of labor for necessary clarification.

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Stassen Plays Bill To Reduce Excise Taxes

WASHINGTON, July 13 —(AP)—Harold E. Stassen charged Tuesday the bill to cut excise taxes embodied an attempt by the Treasury department "to bring American colleges and universities under control of the federal government."

The University of Pennsylvania president heatedly assailed a proposal in the House-approved bill to apply regular corporation tax rates to unrelated business operations by educational institutions.

Stassen spoke out after Senator Byrd (D-Va.) called on the senate to go slow on any tax cutting that will put the treasury deeper in the red.

"His reason: the 'very evident' prospect of increased military spending."

The \$1,010,000,000 tax slashing bill, with its hike in levies on big corporations, has found few — if any — all-out friends to stand up for it in the senate.

Sentence For Vagrancy Given Connie Chairman

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., July 13 —(AP)—The chairman of the Communist Party in Alabama — Sam Hill Jr. — was sentenced to 180 days in jail and fined \$100 on a vagrancy charge last night.

Hill was arrested at his home Saturday when police began a crack-down on Communists in the Birmingham area. Officers who arrested Hill said his house was a "regular warehouse of Communist propaganda."

The party leader said he was southern editor of the Daily Worker, Communist party publication, when advised of the decision.

He said the state law sets out that electrical wiring shall be in "substantial accord" with the national electrical code as approved by the American standards association and under such rules as may be made by the commissioner of labor.

The national code, Volheide said, is a joint product of the national fire protection association and the U.S. bureau of standards and is used widely by states and cities.

Volheide said he assumed the commissioner would confer with the attorney general in an effort to get early settlement of the issue raised by the court decision.

Volheide said that even though the code were unconstitutional as now set up, he thought it possible that the wording of the law might make it possible for the commissioner to reinstate the national code by including it in rules from his office.

Suspected Bank Robber Picked Out Of Police Line-Up

MOSCOW, Idaho, July 13 —(AP)—A 28-year-old man picked out of a police line-up by bank employees was charged here with armed robbery of the first bank of Troy, Idaho.

W. G. Bannister, special agent of the federal bureau of investigation, identified the man as Richard Howard McConnell of Clarkia, Idaho.

Bannister said McConnell was arrested a few hours earlier at Clarkia, a small village in a mountainous area of Shoshone county in Northern Idaho.

The Troy bank was robbed July 7. A young man wearing sun glasses demanded money of teller Jean Krier. He backed up his demand by pointing a long-barreled pistol at her.

Miss Krier fainted and bank vice-president Frank Brocke handed over a stack of bills totaling \$5,448 in twenties, tens, fives and

ones. The robber stuffed the currency in a lunch bucket and walked quietly out the door past a cashier and customer, both unaware a robbery had taken place.

Arraigned before a U. S. commissioner, McConnell was held in lieu of \$10,000 bond.

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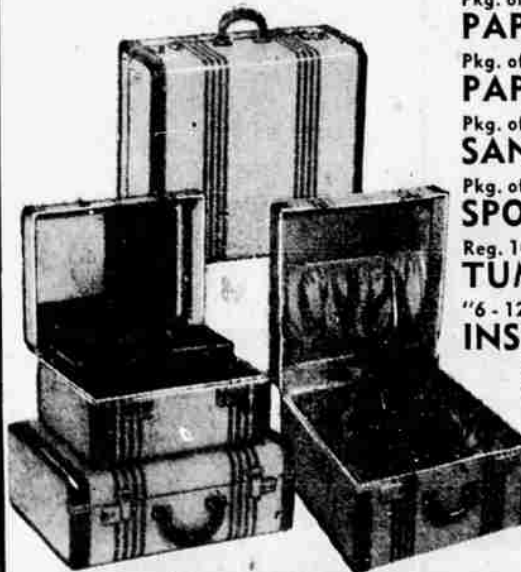
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
