Religious Rights Violated, World Council Is Told

TORONTO, July 13.—(P)—Members of the World Council of Churches predicted here that positive action to spread religious freedom would result from council study of a report charging violations of religious liberty in Roman Catholic and Moslem countries. A council subcommittee is studying the report, submitted by the commission of the churches on international affairs. The 90-member policy-making central committee of the council, holding its annual meeting here now, will discuss the report later.

The commission, after a year-long study, alleged violation of religious liberties in Spain, Italy, Eire, Portugal, the Belgian Congo, Argentina, Colombia, Indonesia and eight countries in the near and middle east. The report asked the council, which represents about 160,000,000 members of Protestant and Orthodox churches in 44 countries, to "pursue a firm, preventive and remedial measure for promoting the observance of religious freedom for all men."

Two-Way Fault Seen Some committee members criticized the absence from the survey of Protestant countries. "We are laying ourselves open to retorts of Roman Catholics that Protestants also are dominant in some states," said the Rev. Edwin T. Dahlberg, pastor of the Syracuse, N. Y., First Baptist church.

Spanish-U.S. War Vets, Auxiliary Elect Heads

EUGENE — (P)— Spanish-American war veterans, meeting here for their 42nd annual state encampment, elected Otto Heckel, of Langlois, as new department of Oregon commander. They also passed a resolution asking the state legislature to pass a law requiring non-Communist pledges from all Oregon teachers. F. George Johnson, Portland, was named Senior vice commander, and J. G. Henry, La Grande, was named senior vice commander. New auxiliary officers are Pearl Lancaster, Bend, department president; Flora E. Fields, Portland, senior vice president; and Mary Harding, Astoria, junior vice president.

Govt.-Trained Doctors Urged To Volunteer

CHICAGO, (P)—Doctors trained at government expense during and since World War II were urged today to volunteer their services for use when needed by the armed forces.

The American Medical Association feels that these young men have a moral responsibility to come forward immediately to offer their services for use when needed, an AMA spokesman said.

"We have no answer unless we correct our own situations," he declared. Charles P. Taft of Cincinnati, O., representing the Protestant Episcopal church, agreed, saying he believed "the study should be general in nature."

Dr. O. Frederick Nolde, dean of the graduate school of Philadelphia's Lutheran Theological seminary and chairman of the reporting commission, had recommended formation of a permanent organization to promote religious freedom. The subcommittee was directed to see if sufficient funds were available.

The central committee also heard an appeal for continuing aid for European refugees. The council's associate general secretary, Dr. Robert Mackie, told the committee 500,000 displaced persons still were in Europe and refugees would be moving to other countries until mid-1951.

Other serious problems were raised, he said, by nearly 1,000,000 unregistered refugees in West Germany and Austria and by some 751,000 Christian refugees from the Palestine war in the middle east.

"If the Protestant church doesn't help the orthodox people among displaced persons," he declared, "the Roman Catholic church will."

Electricians Unit Planned Here By Naval Reservists

The Roseburg naval reserve unit today called for volunteers to help organize an electronics warfare unit, to be formed at the July 17 naval reserve meeting at unit headquarters on the county fairgrounds.

Former servicemen who are not members of a reserve unit of another branch of the armed forces or of the National Guard, are eligible for enlistment in the new organization. Young men over 17 who have had no previous military service are also eligible.

Openings exist for men who were honorably discharged as radiomen, radarmen, electronics technicians, sonormen (harbor defense), fire control technicians, aviation radiomen, aviation electronics technicians, control tower operator, telegraphers, communications technicians (cryptographers), and communication technicians (radio intelligence).

In addition, about 20 seamen, seamen apprentices or seamen recruits are needed. These men may be ex-servicemen who were honorably discharged in their pay grades or men who have had no previous military service.

Persons who hold amateur radio licenses, class A or B, may be enlisted as seamen, and holders of class C licenses may be enlisted as seamen apprentices.

Members of the new unit will receive two days' base pay each month. Interested persons are asked to be present July 17 at 7:30 p.m. at unit headquarters at the fairgrounds.

OS President Goes On Mission To Philippines

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—President A. L. Strand of Oregon State college will spend the next two months in the Philippine Islands as one of five members of a United States economic survey mission named by President Truman to study economic problems of the Philippine republic.

Dr. Strand will serve as the agricultural specialist on the mission and will be concerned especially with agricultural phases of the commission's work. This is considered particularly important because of the vital part agriculture plays in the Philippine economy.
