

Traffic Mishaps To School Buses Drop In Oregon

Traffic accidents involving Oregon school buses last year dropped 43 percent from the 1948 total, figures released by Secretary of State Newberry show.

The record lists 135 school bus traffic mishaps, as compared with 239 the previous year. At the same time, Newberry said the number of buses in operation climbed to more

than 1,300 as school districts throughout the state expanded transportation facilities to meet increasing enrollments.

Placed in effect last year were laws requiring motorists to stop for school buses that have stopped to load or unload passengers and providing for inspection of buses by the department of state. Newberry said both measures undoubtedly played a part in the accident reduction.

Maestro, Denied U.S. Entry, Flies Back To Europe

NEW YORK, July 20 — (AP) — An angry Austrian symphony conductor called off his American debut Tuesday and flew back to Europe after a brush with U.S. immigration authorities.

The conductor, 48-year-old Josef Krips, had been invited to the United States to lead the Chicago symphony in four summer concerts this week. He is chief conductor of the Vienna state opera and also leads the Vienna Philharmonic orchestra.

He and his wife arrived here by air Monday and were immediately detained by the immigration service — for reasons that have not been made public.

Immigration supervisor Edward J. Shaughnessy said only that "certain information" had been received about Krips, and he would not disclose its nature. He gave Krips the choice of leaving voluntarily or being deported, although he had an American entry visa.

Krips said he had no idea what the objection to his visit might be.

"I have never been in the Communist party — right or left," he said.

"I have never been in the Communist party. I am a Catholic. My party is that of Beethoven and Mozart."

He added that the only thing he could recall that might have been held against him was a trip to Moscow and Leningrad in 1947. He said he conducted there at the request of his own government.

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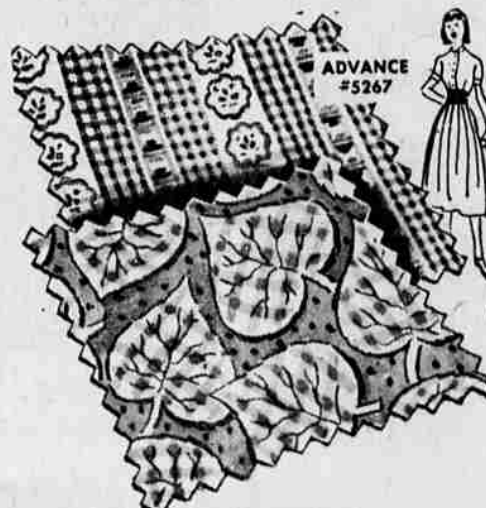


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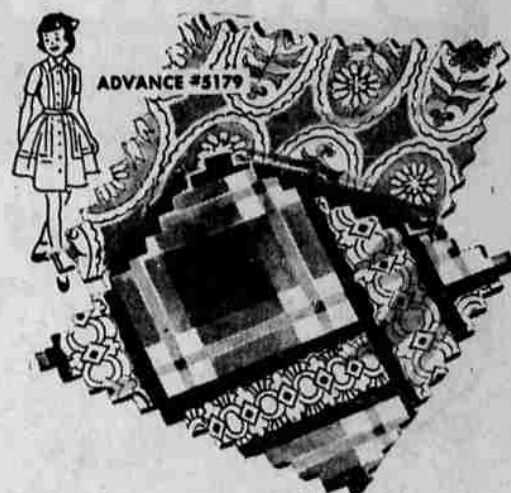
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
