Mill Fights Plan For Sustained Timber Yield Unit. WASHINGTON, July 22.—(P)—The complaint of a California lumber mill that it is about to be deprived of government timber necessary to its operations came to the attention of Congress Thursday. H. J. Andrews, regional forester at Portland, Ore., told the subcommittee there are three sawmills at Lakeview and one at Paisley which have been cutting 65,000,000 board feet a year. The private timber on which they have been working is nearly exhausted, he said, and the continuation of their operations depends on use of government timber. The timber is near mills at Lakeview and Paisley, Ore. The unit is intended to stabilize those communities and assure the mills a permanent supply of timber. The Willow ranch mill, about 20 miles south of Lakeview, six miles outside the unit boundary and in California, has complained it will be deprived of the right to bid on government timber essential to its operations. 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OSC Cyclotron For Atomic Study Being Installed

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—Construction of Oregon State's cyclotron is progressing rapidly this summer, although it will be several months or even a year before it will be completed because of a shortage of funds, according to Dr. E. A. Yunker, head of the O. S. C. physics department. The large steel magnet and pole faces, weighing approximately 50 tons, are in place. The cyclotron itself is surrounded by a concrete wall 30 inches thick to halt any harmful rays. The wall is made of 1700-pound concrete blocks given to the college by the Consolidated Builders of Portland. A 40 by 60 foot Butler-type building will house the cyclotron, which is located a short distance southwest of the new college coliseum. Steel for the magnet was made available to Oregon State college without cost by the atomic energy commission after it had been discarded as worthless except for magnet purposes. It originally had been used for an experimental magnet at the University of California. Dr. R. R. Dempster and Dr. J. Brady, nuclear physicists at O. S. C., estimate total cost of the Oregon State cyclotron will be less than \$50,000, only a fraction of the market price of a similar machine. When completed, the cyclotron will be used for research and for training graduate students in techniques of nuclear physics. It will also insure a steady supply of radio isotopes needed in many fields of related research, such as biology, chemistry and medical studies.
