

U.S. Stand In Korea Heartens West Germany

PORTLAND —(AP)—The United States' stand in Korea is heartening to the people of Western Germany, a state department official, home from Munich, says.

George H. Godfrey, former head of the University of Oregon news bureau, now the top U. S. administrator in Munich, Germany, said the Korean action indicates what might happen in the event of a move by the Reds in Germany.

People in Western Germany take a calmer view of the Korean situation than do those in the United States, Godfrey said, possibly because of a more subdued treatment of the news by the Stars and Stripes, the only American newspaper in the region.

Official Accused Of Being Red Is Named By Morse

WASHINGTON, July 27 —(AP)—Senator Morse (R-Ore) Tuesday told the Senate that Edward G. Posniak is the "important state department official accused by Senator McCarthy (R-Wis) of being a Communist."

Morse disclosed the man's identity in the Senate a few minutes after Senator McMahon (D-Conn) had read an affidavit signed by Morse attesting to Posniak's loyalty.

McCarthy had told the Senate earlier he had air-tight proof that an important state department official — whom he referred to as "Mr. X" — is a Communist.

McCarthy said the proof was contained in the State department's own loyalty file on the man. The Wisconsin senator produced a purported copy of the file. He said his evidence was furnished by "an FBI agent, an undercover agent, (who) joined the Communist party in 1937 at the suggestion of the FBI."

Morse told the Senate he signed the affidavit attesting to Posniak's loyalty back in 1936 when Morse was an assistant to the attorney general.

Posniak, Morse said, worked for him in the Justice department at that time.

Posniak, informed of the developments in the Senate, told a reporter: "I have no comment at this time. I will have a statement to make later, you can be sure of that..."

Posniak is listed in the State department's register as 39 years of age and a native of Moscow who was naturalized in 1939. He entered

the department as an economist served in the Justice department. His present classification is of strategic services and the army. Oct. 10, 1945. Previously he had GS-13, meaning he is paid between the housing authority office \$7,600 and \$8,600 a year.

Crash Kills Motorist Near Klamath Falls

KLAMATH FALLS, —(AP)—Frank Sylvester Cour, 53, of Portland, was killed outright about midnight on U. S. 97 at Sand Creek, some 50 miles north of Klamath Falls.

State police officer Milton Deter said Cour's car hit a gravel shoulder on the highway, spun across the road and crashed 100 feet through a jackpine thicket.

The man's body was thrown 72 feet ahead of the car.

A passenger, Ferdinand Alexander Zick of Portland, was only slightly injured.

2 More Units For ONG Anti-Aircraft Force Asked

PORTLAND, —(AP)—Maj. Gen. Thomas E. Rilea asked authorities for permission to activate two more batteries for the 237th anti-aircraft group of the national guard.

They would probably be organized in the Redmond-Prineville area and at Newport, he said.

Batteries are now functioning at Portland, Burns, Ashland and Klamath Falls-Lakeview.
