

Fined \$20 For Yanking Feather Out Of Parrot

PHILADELPHIA. — (AP) — Magistrate James W. McBride has ruled that a parrot's tail feathers are too firmly anchored to fall out without some outside assistance.

Mrs. Mildred Hines, 27, was arraigned before McBride on cruelty charges perferred by the parrot's owner, John Cavanna. Mrs. Hines said she was merely brushing the bird when its tail feather "came out somehow." McBride considered the evidence and fined Mrs. Hines \$20.



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Bean Pickers Are Urgently Needed

The Abner Rice bean farm south of Dillard is desperately in need of pickers, and can accommodate all comers, the Oregon State Employment office has announced.

Rice usually has obtained the bulk of his pickers from Myrtle Creek, but this year pickers have not responded.

He announced that his truck will be in Myrtle Creek each morning at 7 o'clock at the bus terminal to transport pickers. They need not register in advance.

The warm weather has ripened the bean fields rapidly, and unless the crop is picked as the beans mature, considerable loss may be incurred, employment officials state.

Additional pickers are also needed in the Roseburg area. All persons who desire to work are advised to be at the junior high school at 7 a.m., whether or not they have registered.

U.S. Air Force Power Increase Scheduled

WASHINGTON. — (AP) — The air force is increasing its strength from 48 groups to 58 within 12 months and to 69 groups by January, 1953, Rep. Vinson (D-Ga.) announced.

The air force is beginning immediately to step up officers and men to a target of 548,311.

This is an increase of 136,311 over its strength on June 30, said Vinson, the chairman of the House Armed Forces committee.

The increase in group and personnel strength is made possible through the air force's allotment of \$4,535,500,000 of President Truman's emergency additional budget request of \$10,500,000,000.

Federal Court Terms At Salem Authorized

WASHINGTON. — (AP) — Legislation to authorize federal court terms in Salem, Ore., was passed today by the house and sent to the President.

The court now sits in Medford, Klamath Falls, Pendleton, Portland and Eugene.

The House also passed and sent to the Senate a bill to remove a provision that terms of the court may be held in Klamath Falls only if quarters are furnished without cost.

Former Soldier Nabbed With Batch Of Heroin

SEATTLE. — (AP) — A former soldier, Joseph Hunt of Seattle, was arrested by narcotics agents here yesterday as he stepped off an airplane from San Francisco.

More than \$1,000 worth of heroin was found in his luggage, agents said. Arraigned before a U.S. commissioner, Hunt was jailed in lieu of \$3,000 bond.

Offices Opened In Carter Bldg. By Water Corp.

With completion of the sale by California-Oregon Power company of its water properties to the Oregon Water Corporation, the latter company has opened its offices in Roseburg at 219 No. Main street, downstairs in the Carter building.

However, to facilitate handling the billing of accounts, Copco will continue to mail out statements for those accounts due prior to Aug. 15. After that date the Oregon Water corporation will take over the complete operation, it is announced.

Walter H. Smith, is the local manager for the Oregon Water Corporation. He formerly served here for two and a half years as water superintendent for California Oregon Power company.

Smith announced that all operating personnel has been retained. Additional help has been necessary to staff the local office.

Tentative sale of Copco's water holdings was announced in June. Completion of the transaction was contingent upon final approval by the public utilities commissioner of Oregon. A hearing was held here the latter part of June.

Affected also in the transaction are the Copco holdings at Oakland and at Klamath Falls.

A subsidiary of the corporation has also purchased the California Water holdings of Copco at Dunsmuir and Fort Jones.

Fire Razes Warehouse Of Eugene Business Firm

EUGENE. — (AP) — An early morning fire completely destroyed the Alaska Junk and Machinery company warehouse causing damage variously estimated at from \$25,000 to \$40,000.

Sam Bernstein, owner, said that only about ten percent of the loss was insured. The fire reportedly started in the bushes near the company's railroad dock.

Seine-Net Fishermen Operate During Law Tilt

ASTORIA, Ore. — (AP) — Seine-net fishermen operated on the Columbia river again today after asking a new hearing on a law to ban them.

Through legal battles they have continued to operate in the two years since Oregon voters passed a law to keep seiners off the river. The state supreme court upheld the law three weeks ago.

The new appeal enables them to fish while legal arguments proceed.

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Woman Killed By Train As She Flees Stalled Auto

GARY, Ind. — (AP) — Four persons scrambled from a stalled automobile on a railroad crossing near here last night, but one, a woman, was so scared she ran down the track into an oncoming electric train and was killed.

She was Mrs. Fannie Zussin, 59, of Chicago.

Her husband, Victor Zussin, also 59, suffered a broken leg in his jump from the car. The other two escaped unhurt.

Pendleton Fixes Rules For Garbage Disposal

PENDLETON. — (AP) — Garbage collection is compulsory in Pendleton now through an ordinance passed by the city council to regulate sanitation.

The city was divided into two zones. Garbage collection licenses were issued to only two outfits one to a zone. All other licenses were revoked. The collectors will have to meet stiff regulations. The law was patterned after one at Albany.

Property owners can haul their garbage to the city dump if they want to. But they have to keep their residences clean. No more burying refuse in the backyard, or letting it pile up in a shed.

Heiress' Piggery Project Faces Ban On Swill

HILLSBOROUGH, N. J. — (AP) — Tobacco heiress Doris Duke Rubi-rosa can raise pigs on her model farm—but she can't feed them imported garbage.

The township board of health made the ruling after the Duke farms manager, Rudolph F. Somers, notified the municipality that she was considering plans for a model piggery on her 2,200-acre estate.

There was no objection by the board to feeding the porkers on

grain, but the body ruled importing swill for feed was illegal.

The heiress, biggest taxpayer in the community, has announced plans for a \$50,000 piggery built of concrete, air conditioned and equipped with water sprays, drains and atomizers.

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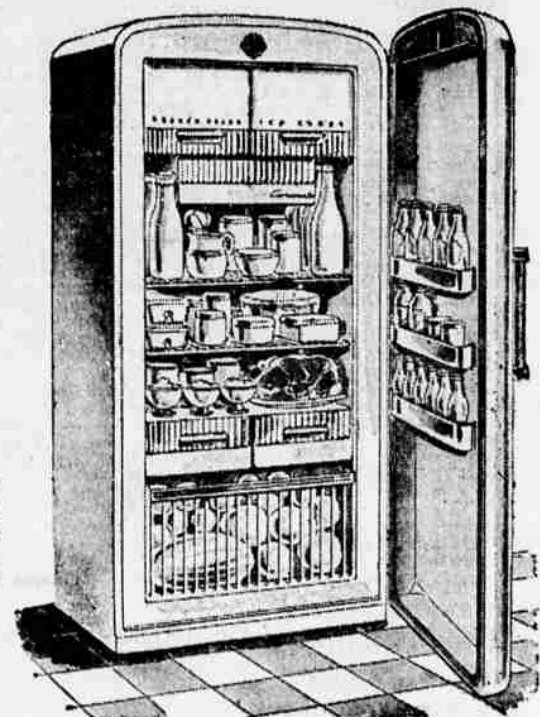
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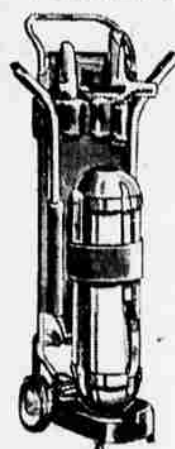
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
