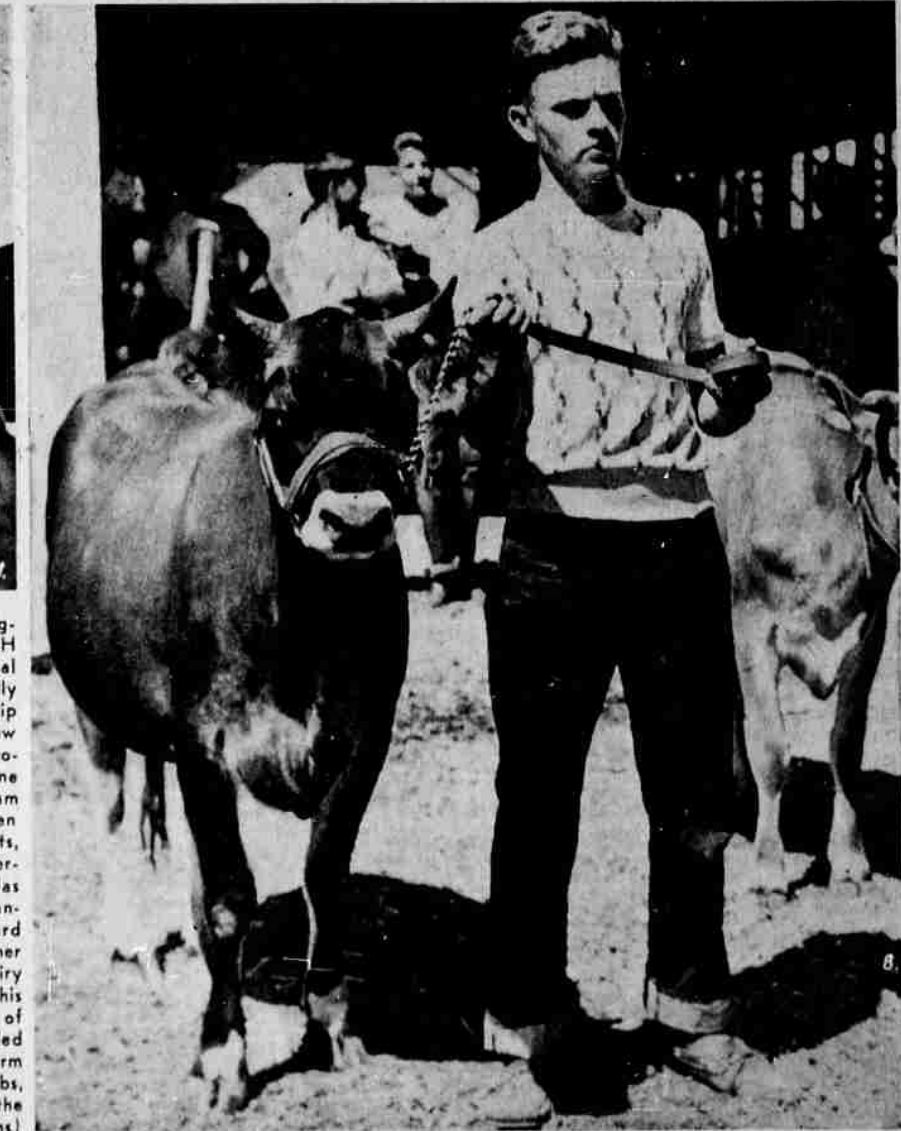
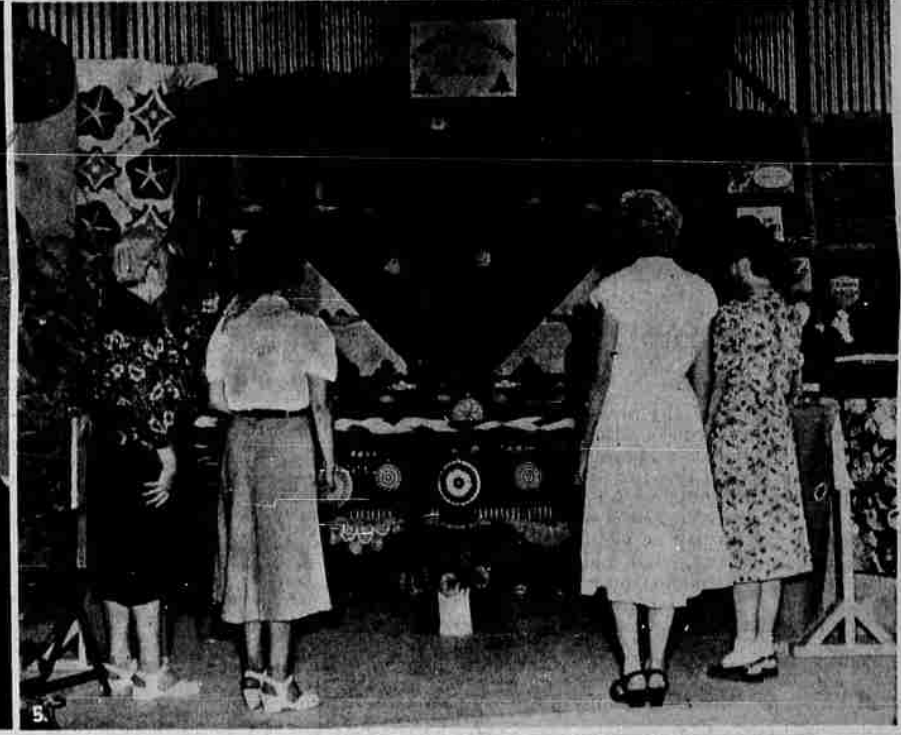
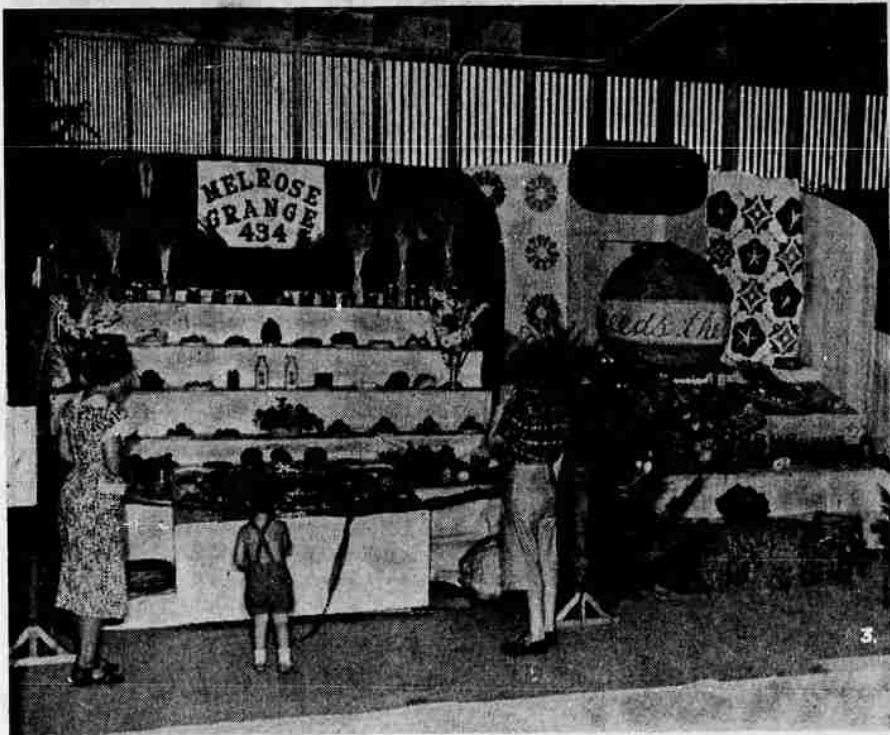


Douglas County Fair Opening Draws Crowds Witnessing Judging, Exhibits
