Reservist Confused By Conflicting U.S. Orders

FORT WORTH, Tex. —(AP) If Obie D. Boyd obeys all the government orders he has someone to go to be confused, and it might be him.

Boyd has been ordered to duty as a marine sergeant and also as a navy mailman third class.

His marine corps orders direct him to report Sept. 6. A letter also came from the Eighth naval district of New Orleans, telling him to appear there Aug. 31.

The mix-up started when he "re-signed" from the naval reserve last year to go into the marine reserve with some friends.

The marine recruiters assured him they would waive him a navy discharge if he'd sign up. He did—apparently they didn't.

North American Shoot Champion Loses 2nd Round

VANDALIA, O. —(AP)—Husky Arnold Reigger of Seattle finished second best yesterday in his efforts to defend his North American clay target championship, but he and other northwest gunners finished high in the second day's shooting at the 51st grand American trapshoot.

Mrs. Cal Ray, the 120-pound sharpshooter from Eugene, Ore., broke 199x200 to win the women's North American title. It was the Oregon woman's first national crown although she and her husband, a retired lumberman, walked off with the husband-wife title in 1948 and 1949.

Her winning score yesterday was two targets ahead of any ever fired in the feminine event in 32 years.

Reigger lost his national title in one of the most devastating displays of marksmanship the big trap shoot has ever witnessed. The Seattle man broke 200 straight targets but finished the regular shooting in a tie with Joe Devers, 19, of Dayton, O., and Dr. C. A. Roose, Salem, O. In the 25-bird shootoff, Devers kept his perfect eye while Reigger missed once and Roose three times.

Two other Washington marksmen narrowly missed perfection. Stanley Brock of Walla Walla and Curtis Melville of Sprague each broke 199x200.

Officer Stops Wanted Parolee With Miss Shot

PORTLAND —(AP)—The day was a hot one, so Detective William L. Brian took it easy.

When James K. Crisler, 21, wanted for car theft, ignored an order to halt — Brian pulled his gun and fired one shot. It was then too hot for Crisler, who fell screaming to the mid-town pavement, his hands in the air.

The young El Reno, Okla., reformatory parolee wasn't nicked. He later was jailed under \$1,500 bail.

"The fellow ran when we came up to him," explained Brian, "and it's just too hot to chase anybody — so I stopped him the easy way."

LOS ANGELES —(AP)—Mickey Rooney is behind in his alimony, says his ex-wife No. 2, Betty Jane Rase, who sets the figure at a specific \$3,541.64.

The former Miss Birmingham declared in a petition filed Monday that Rooney has violated a court order granting her \$12,500 a year alimony, plus \$5,000 annually for the support of their two boys.

Rooney previously was wed to Ava Gardner and is now the husband of actress Martha Vickers.

OKLAHOMA CITY —(AP)—Oklahoma has posted guards at the Red river across from northeastern Texas counties to block the shipment of cattle into the state from that area.

Harold Huton, president of the state board of agriculture, announced the action following an outbreak of Anthrax, a highly contagious cattle disease. The quarantine is to prevent spread of the disease into this state.

Stanley Earl May Take State Tax Board Position

PORTLAND —(AP)—There is speculation in labor circles here that Stanley Earl, former secretary of the Oregon CIO council, might take a job with the state tax commission.

Earl refused comment, but didn't flatly deny that he had been offered an investigation position with the commission.

The former state labor leader quit his union job last year to work for the federal government's Economic Cooperation administration in Korea. He returned with his family when North Korea Communists invaded South Korea.

He is a member of the CIO International Woodworkers of America and when he went to Korea paid his dues in advance for three

years. If he entered state service he likely would join the AFL State, County and Municipal Employees union since it has jurisdiction over employees in the state tax office.

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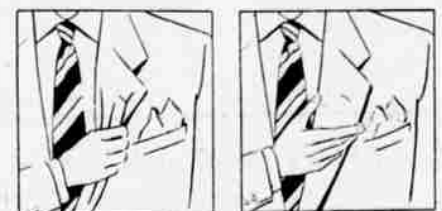
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
