Truman Rapped For San On MacArthur's Views

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Republicans have put into the congressional record the text of Gen. Douglas MacArthur's statement on Formosa and sharply criticized President Truman for directing that the general withdraw it.

Republican leader Joe Martin told the House it was "unfortunate" that the President sought to "suppress" the statement after MacArthur sent it to the Chicago encampment of Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Martin said Mr. Truman's action was "another exhibit of bankrupt leadership."

"It is to be taken by the American people as another flagrant example of the incredible bungling by the administration over the past five years, bungling which delivered Manchuria and most of China to the Communists and which culminated in the Korean conflict," he said.

"It is simply another chapter in a long series of blunders whereby sound military advice was suppressed and political decisions, in keeping with the policy of appeasing the Soviet Union, were superimposed for political reasons."

Alleged Saboteurs Freed By French Military Court

LYON, France — (AP) — A French military court Saturday acquitted 18 persons accused of sabotage under a law avowedly aimed at halting Communist attempts to wreck U.S. military aid to France.

They were arrested after a military convoy was attacked on the road near here. Parliament has just passed a law making such offenses liable to severe penalties and subject to handling before military courts. At that time justice minister Mayer had said no mercy would be shown to Communists, who had dumped French arms into the sea and boasted American arms would not be permitted to enter France.
