PHILADELPHIA — (AP) — A 38-year-old shepherd and his dog walked 2,900 miles from Seattle, Wash., to Philadelphia looking for work.

Andrew Boehm arrived at a fire house last night with his dog, Shep.

The shepherd, who said he had worn out eight pairs of socks and three pairs of shoes in his cross country hike, was crestfallen to learn there are few calls for sheep herders in the Philadelphia area.

Boehm said he had hoped to find a job here so that he could earn money for a trip to Germany to visit his mother. Despite the pessimistic report of job openings, he said he will make an effort to locate work.

The Rev. Mr. Houston was associate pastor of Calvary Baptist church at Salem before going to India. He is a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Houston, Oregon City.

The convention office reported none of its 47 missionaries in India was injured by the quake but that property damage was high.

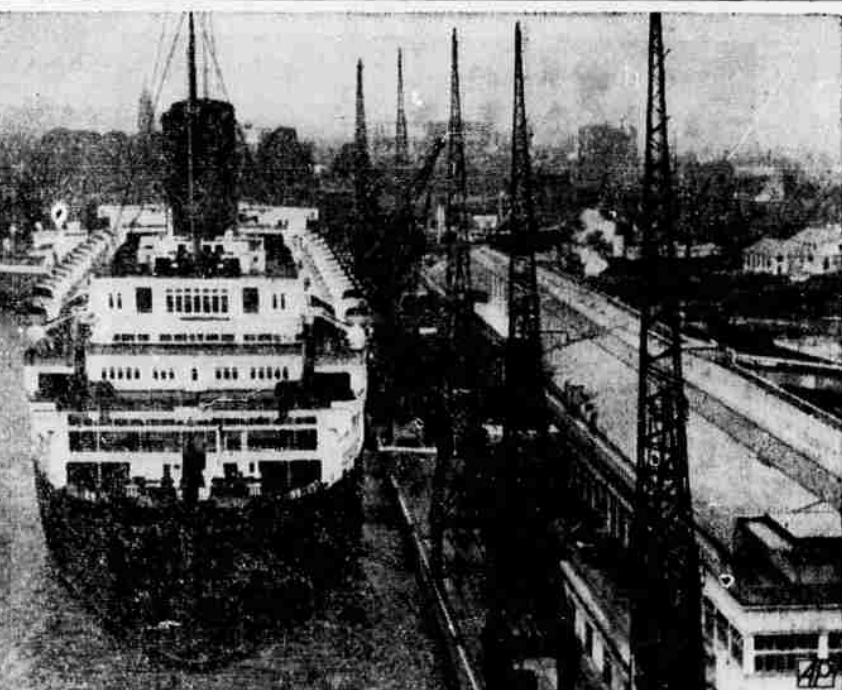

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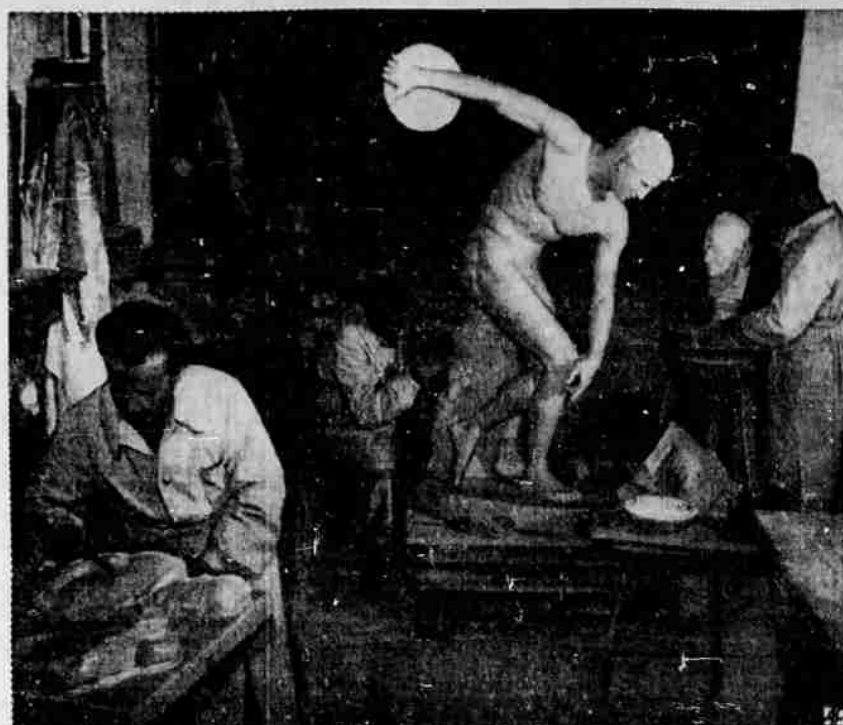

Tax On Transient Logs Upheld By Supreme Court

SALEM, O. — (AP) — The state supreme court ruled Tuesday that flood river county may levy a \$8,449 tax on some Washington state log rafts which were moored temporarily in the Columbia river in that county.

The logs, 64 rafts of them, were owned by Stebo Incorporated, a company which hauls its logs down the river from Underwood and Lyle, Wash., to its mill five miles west of Vancouver, Wash.

On Jan. 1, 1947, the annual property assessment date, the logs were temporarily in Hood River county, so the county sheriff slapped on the tax.

The company sued the sheriff, claiming that the county had no right to tax property moving in interstate commerce.

Circuit Judge M. W. Wilkinson of Hood River ruled in favor of the company.

But Tuesday decision by Justice George Rossman reversed him, and ordered the tax paid.

In another case, the supreme court ruled that the state gets the \$15,000 estate of Mrs. G. P. Crusan Sr., who was killed with her husband in an automobile accident on the Santiam highway near Cascade.

Their bodies were found the day after the accident. Mr. Crusan had a son and daughter, who claimed that Mrs. Crusan died first, and that they thus were entitled to the estates of both their father and Mrs. Crusan.

But the state sued, claiming Mrs. Crusan's estate because she had no heirs. The Linn county circuit court ruled in favor of the son and daughter.

Tuesday's decision by Justice Rossman reversed the lower court. It held that under a 1947 law, both are presumed to have died at the same time, and that each estate is separate.

The decision thus gives Mrs. Crusan's estate to the state, and Mr. Crusan's to the heirs.

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Ordeal In Lake Tragedy Draws Angler's Pledge

TOLEDO, O. — (AP) — The next time Thomas Navarre of Toledo goes fishing he'll choose a babbling brook. Here's why:

His fishing boat overturned Sunday, and a companion, Harold P. Meidt, 30, Toledo, died in Lake Erie. For 20 hours Navarre fought to keep alive.

He beat off sharp-billed sea gulls as the cold water numbed his arms. Then artillery from the Erie ordnance depot firing range opened up with practice shots, and shells fell in the water near the 33-year-old Toledo man.

Finally two fishermen picked up Navarre about seven miles offshore from the ordnance depot, near Port Clinton, O.

Navarre, a truck driver, told his rescuers: "It was a terrible experience. They'll never get me out on that lake again."

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Oregon Saves On Making Children Aid Parents

PORTLAND — (AP) — Oregon saved \$225,304 in a year because a 1949 law makes children financially responsible for their parents, Loz Howard said.

Miss Howard, administrator for the State Public Welfare commission, said \$193,247 was collected between July 16, 1949, and July 31 this year. The money came from the children of persons on old age assistance and other welfare rolls.

The rest of the saving, she said, resulted from dropping 431 persons because their children could support them and from denying 248 applications on the same ground.

Some, she said, resisted payment but finally agreed rather than accept publicity of a court action. In no case, she said, did the commission have to go to court.

Miss Howard said this was the first report on operation of the law and she added the figures indicated the law was a good one.

The commission spent \$18,000 in sending out 110,000 affidavits to relatives of persons on welfare rolls, to obtain information on whether the children were able to contribute to their parents' support.

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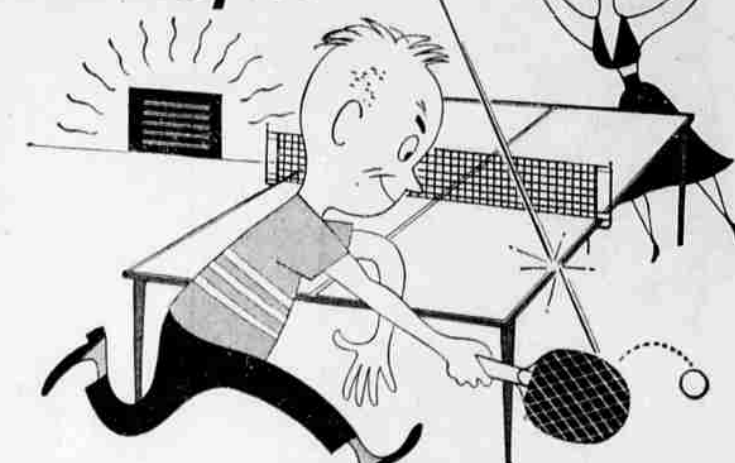
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
