### Examinations Slated For 9-Year-Old Boy

PORTLAND — (AP)— Two psychiatric examinations are scheduled for Gary Marshall Ziegler, 8, the Canby boy who killed his mother a week ago.

Circuit Judge Donald E. Long, designated to hear the boy's case, said he would not open a hearing for the boy until both examinations are completed. He said this probably would be in two weeks. Young Gary calmly told police after shooting his mother: "Sure, I shot her. I didn't like her."

The mother, Mrs. Mathilde Ziegler Laier, was shot as she prepared to take Gary and his sister from the home of their father, Marshall H. Ziegler. She had remarried after divorce from Ziegler last January.

PORTLAND — (AP)— A laundry pick-up driver who picked up merchandise and laundry with equal enthusiasm, was out on \$1,000 bond Saturday.

A department store retrieved \$20,000 worth of merchandise, using two trucks to haul it back.

Ben Wexler, 35, was the laundry driver. He was arrested Friday night on a grand larceny charge.

Detectives Dale Patterson and Andrew Heckman said he told them it was quite simple: six days a week since 1947 he had visited the store, picking up laundry on each floor. Along with the laundry, he stuffed into bags such things as electric appliances, clothing and groceries.

Nothing was sold, he said, and the detective said little had been used.
