Lyman J. Green Dies Tuesday

Lyman Jesse Green, 58, died Tuesday night, Sept. 12, at Mercy hospital following a heart attack. Mr. Green was born in Greenville, Mo., May 30, 1892, and moved in 1912 with his parents to Hoquiam, Wash., where he resided until his marriage to Miss Aurilla McGregor Dec. 6, 1924. He and his wife lived at Aberdeen, Wash., until moving to Roseburg Dec. 18, 1945.

He served in World War I in France with the 20th Engineering corps, U. S. army. Since moving to Roseburg Mr. Green worked continuously for the Umpqua Plywood Corp. until July 27, 1950, when he suffered a heart attack.

He was a member of Laurel lodge 13, A. F. & A. M., Roseburg; BPO Elks lodge No. 593, Aberdeen, Wash.; O. O. E. No. 24, Aberdeen, and Henry L. Robb post V. F. W., Hoquiam, Wash. Surviving are his widow, Aurilla, 124 E. Oakland Ave., Roseburg, and the following brothers and sisters, Robert A. Roseburg, Milford C. Neilson, Wash.; Mrs. Freeda Cogdill and Mrs. Ira Erickson, Aberdeen.

Masonic funeral services will be held in the Chapel of the Roses, Roseburg funeral home, Saturday, Sept. 16, at 11 a.m., under auspices of Laurel lodge 13. Cremation will follow.
