Half Million Judgment Given

SEATTLE — (AP) — A superior court judge awarded the Superior 432 judgment against the Pacific Portland Cement company a \$533,000 judgment for damages because of alleged violation of an option agreement.

Testimony in the case showed the Superior company had operated Pacific's Diamond Cement plant in Seattle 17 years under a lease from Pacific. Under lease provisions Superior was entitled to first chance to buy the plant at the same price a third party might offer.

In 1947 Henry Kaiser's Permanente Cement company purchased the Seattle plant tentatively, and operated it for two and a half years. Last year the state supreme court held Permanente had acquired the plant in violation of the option agreement held by Superior.

Superior sued for \$1,650,000 contending it lost that sum in income. Judge Malcolm O'Douglas held, however, that the proper measure of damages was reasonable rental value for the period—March 1, 1947, to Aug. 31, 1949.

A claim of the Superior company for allowance of attorneys' fees of \$175,000 will be heard by Judge Douglas Sept. 23.

Fishing Vessel Crewmen Take Mysterious Ride

PORTLAND, Me. — (AP) — Crewmen of two Portland fishing draggers have returned from a mysterious ocean tow ride which, they say, scared them half to death off Brier Island, N. S.

Skipper of the 110 foot Cherokee and the 86 foot Evzone told a strange story of how their vessels were towed helplessly last Wednesday night by an underwater object they could not see.

Was it a submarine? Probably, say skipper Arthur W. and Thomas Jordan. They told a newsman it might have been a Russian sub but added that their surmise was based only on their understanding that no American subs were in the area and that Canada has none.

Could it have been a whale? No, the skipper says, because whales can not stay submerged for such long periods.

The tow rides followed each other. The Evzone was towed an hour and a half, the Cherokee about 25 minutes. Both craft had their sterns dragged beneath the water by a terrific haul. They were freed when their cables snapped from whatever was tugging them.

"It was a nightmare," said the skipper.

Netherlands And Indonesia Both Watch New Guinea; 'Imperialism' Charges Made

With much of Asia revolting against "western imperialism" it is interesting to see both The Netherlands and the new Republic of Indonesia vying for the privilege of colonizing Dutch New Guinea, whose possession now is in dispute between them.

In fairness one hastens to add that Dutch New Guinea presents a unique situation. It is called the last stand of stone age man because it is inhabited by primitive hunters and cannibals. It will require generations to educate these wild folk to the point where they can establish civilized communities. Meantime, of course, some outside guidance and protection will be imperative.

Thus the question of "imperialism," doesn't arise in this case. Still, that term of opprobrium is bound to come up sooner or later, and so must be taken into account by any power—Asiatic or Western—which undertakes colonization.

Third Largest Island

If you will glance at your maps you will see that New Guinea—world's third largest island—nestles up against the equator just north of Australia. The western part is Dutch and the eastern is Australian. It is hot and humid, insect infested and fever ridden. And there are the stone age savages.

However, on the other side of the picture the island is noted for its variety of birds, rare orchids

More Workers For Red Cross Volunteer Effort

A program to interest more Douglas county residents in serving their community through the American Red Cross is being launched this week, according to Mrs. Mildred Herman, executive secretary of the local chapter.

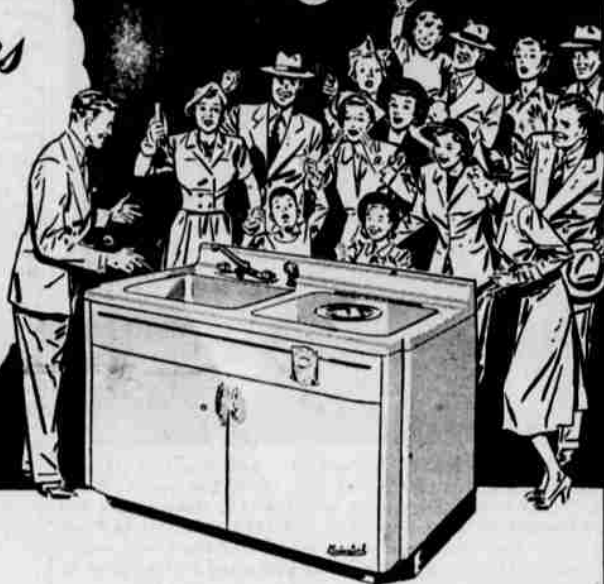
