U.S. Tells Greece Marshall Plan Aid Cut Is Due Unless People Assist

ATHENS — (AP) — The United States has notified the Greek government it will cut Marshall plan aid because of dissatisfaction with Greek efforts to help themselves. The American decision was made known at a conference between ECA Chief Paul Porter and leading agency officials with Premier Sophocles Venizelos and his coalition government leaders. The amount of the reduction is to be determined in Washington. The radical action was taken by the American mission following an appraisal of the Greek situation in Washington. A spokesman for Porter said the Americans felt that Greece had not done as much as it could to help itself, and therefore there was going to be a reduction in the amount of aid. Greece originally was allocated \$220,000,000 in Marshall plan funds for the current fiscal year. The American spokesman made it clear that the action was not directed against the Greek government which took office Wednesday. He said it represented an estimate of past failures to utilize American aid, and added that the cut could be compensated for by greater effort on the part of Greece.

tion, to convince Greek leaders that substantial economic reforms and economies were essential to the continuance of U.S. aid. These called for greater diligence in the collection of taxes, particularly from the wealthy classes, the elimination of bureaucratic confusion which slowed and sometimes blocked specific programs, and a sharp reduction in government expenditures. Mission officials said privately there were many Greek civil servants in high positions who consistently have used their positions to favor selected groups. American efforts to correct these inequities have been futile, they asserted. These informants pointed out that Greece has plenty of dollar exchange, but that it is short in its own currency because government expenditures far exceed revenue. They noted that Greece and the ECA several weeks ago signed an agreement for \$200,000,000 worth of electric power projects, but that this was not carried out because the Greek government could not produce currency to have been obtained from a higher collection of taxes and lower government spending.

City in N. Y. Orders Registration of Reds

NEW ROCHELLE, N. Y. — (AP) — All Communists in this New York suburban city must register with the police. Jail terms and fines for violators are provided in an ordinance passed unanimously by the city council. Registration is required of all Communists who reside, work or have businesses here or who regularly enter or travel through the city. The ordinance was requested by Mayor Stanley W. Church "as an emergency measure because of present world conditions." The mayor said he could not estimate how many Communists there are among the 70,000 population.
