

Mother Identifies Son In P.O.W. Photograph

NEW YORK — (AP) — A mother looked at a photograph, described as showing American soldiers in a North Korean prisoner of war camp, and exclaimed: "Yes, that's Billie."

The photograph, one of several of similar scenes distributed by the Associated Press, was the first identification Mrs. William H. Stansbury of Kansas City, Mo., had of the fate of her son. He was reported missing in action July 8.

The Associated Press obtained the photos from Eastfoto, a New York picture agency, which said it received them from the China Photo service in Peiping, China.

"It's a relief to know what happened to him. You just are notified that he has disappeared and then no one knows anything. It's a lot better to know."

Her husband declined to confirm the identification. But other members of the Stansbury family agreed it was Billy even though the picture caption as received from China spelled the family name as Tonesbury.

Opening Prices Paid For Oregon Russet Potatoes

PORTLAND — (AP) — A wholesale price of \$2.85-2.90 a sack was paid Thursday for the first central Oregon russet potatoes to reach here this season.

For Washington russets, the price was \$2.75-2.85.

Central Oregon's harvest will hit a peak about Oct. 1. Some 3,000 workers, two-thirds of them imported, will be needed, growers reported.

Kaiser Portland Plant Produces Its First Car

PORTLAND — (AP) — The Kaiser company turned out its first automobile from its Portland assembly plant Thursday.

First of a series of proposed assembly operations for various parts of the country, the plant here receives parts from Willow Run and assembles them. Some 90 items are purchased locally, rather than being sent from the factory, manager W. M. Pearce said.

Although the first car has passed inspection, full operation is not expected for about six weeks. At peak operation, about 30 cars can be assembled during each shift. Two shifts are planned.
