Inflation Surge Reflected In Volume Of Money Deals; Drain Of Savings Indicated

NEW YORK — (AP) — A bubble-up in the money affairs of

citizens and nations today reflects the surge of inflation.

Uncle Sam's books have gone into the black since the outbreak of the Korean war—although he has laid himself out to pay huge sums for defense in the future.

Britain and other nations in the sterling area have more than doubled their hoard of gold and dollar reserves in a year, with the Korean war giving promise of a richer golden stream ahead.

Canada's reserves of U.S. dollars is also swelling as Uncle Sam rearms, and its own dollar looks better and better to American investors.

In this country the money supply is at a new peak. A spurt in bank credit — part to finance expanding industrial activity, part to underwrite consumer credit and installment paper — has sent the volume of bank deposits and money in the hands of individuals to \$171.1 billion, an all-time high, the Federal Reserve board reports.

This was a gain of \$14 billion since the war started, and a jump of \$700 million in the month of August. The board says only \$100 million of the August gain was in currency in people's pockets. Demand deposits rose \$900 million. From this total gain of \$1 billion the board deducts a fall in time deposits of \$200 million and in postal savings deposits of \$100 million.

Draw On Savings
This see-sawing of deposits, credit, savings and money apparently gives another indication that people have been dipping into their savings to buy consumer goods. The rise in demand deposits is due, among other things, to the rush of money through the channels of trade as buying increased all along the line from retail stores to suppliers of raw materials. It is also due to reflects the money banks lent corporations to finance this trade and production.

The Securities and Exchange commission notes that this same drop in savings was well underway before the war. Reporting on the months of April, May and June, SEC finds that Americans were saving \$200 million less in "liquid" savings than in the same months of 1949.

The contrast with prewar years was even more striking. In the first half of this year Americans were saving in "liquid" form only one percent of income after taxes, but in 1940 they were saving almost six percent. SEC defines "liquid" savings as currency and bank deposits, equity in savings and loan associations, insurance, pension reserves, securities and repayment of mortgage debt and other consumer debt.

Of this list, insurance and pension reserves made the best showing this year, rising to \$1.3 billion. SEC notes that an important form of non-liquid saving — purchases of homes — was way ahead of former years.

The U. S. Treasury's going into the black for better than \$296 million in the first three months of the Korean war is traced in part to diminished government spending, but in much greater amount to increased tax receipts.

Husband Of 2 Months Faces Charge Of Arson
BALTIMORE — (AP) — Her husband told her she should "see something in a minute" — and then set fire to their home, a bride of two months testified in police court Tuesday.

Mrs. Virginia Fitzpatrick told magistrate Thomas Fitzpatrick that her husband had previously threatened to "hurt me mentally, rather than physically."

The husband, George Padgett, 27, was held without bail for grand jury action on a charge of arson.

He pleaded innocent and contended he had been the victim of a frame-up he said had been rigged by his wife and her twin, Mrs. Alice Getz.

The sisters both testified they saw him set the fire which scorched the side of the Padgett's Northwest Baltimore home Monday.

Mrs. Padgett testified that about two weeks ago her husband told her he wanted a separation.

Public Caucus Called In Canyonville Monday

Qualified voters of Canyonville will have an opportunity to nominate candidates for mayor, recorder, city treasurer and five councilposts at a public caucus meeting next Monday, Oct. 9, at 8 p.m. in the council room of the city hall.

The offices of mayor, recorder and treasurer have one-year terms. Three councilmen with two-year terms and two councilmen with one-year terms will be nominated.

Clifford Beals is the only councilman whose tenure will not expire at this time.

Oregon Legislator Hurt In Traffic Crash

OREGON CITY — (AP) — H. H. Chindgren, 38, veteran Clackamas county legislator, was hospitalized here with injuries suffered when his car collided with a truck and semi-trailer.

State policeman Ralph Hillman said the trailer jack-knifed in front of Chindgren's car at the junction of the Union Mills-Molalla-Oregon City highway. The state representative was pinned inside the car by the bent dashboard.

Chindgren suffered nose and pelvic fractures, deep face cuts, a possible leg fracture and body cuts.

Highest Award Slated For Native Of Hungary

PHILADELPHIA — (AP) — The Franklin Institute announced that Dr. Eugene Paul Wigner, of Princeton university, has been chosen to receive the institute's highest award, the Franklin medal.

Dr. Wigner was selected, the institute said, because of his "important contributions in the field of modern atomic physics."

The 48-year old scientist was born at Budapest, Hungary, and became a naturalized U. S. citizen in 1937.

Newbry Seeks More Frequent Voter List Checks

SALEM, — (AP) — Secretary of State Newbry says he will ask the legislature for help in getting registration lists revised more frequently.

The law now requires county clerks to purge registration rolls after each election to remove the names of those who have not voted for two years.

Newbry said he learned, from

the number of voters' pamphlets returned to his office by the post office, that many persons listed as registered voters have moved out of the state.

For instance, he said the town of Bly in Klamath county lists 356 registered voters. Newbry's office sent pamphlets to them, but 38 percent could not be delivered.
