

## Alaska Election Gives Comfort To Both Parties

Juneau, Alaska — (AP) — Alaska's Democratic party chairman, Sen. Victor Rivers of Anchorage, appeared today as a definite political casualty in Tuesday's general election.

less than 1,000 estimated to be missing, the senator was 750 votes behind the two Republican candidates.

While apparently sending two Republicans, Gerrit Snider and Sen. Gunnard Egebreth, to the territorial senate, the division again is sending an overwhelmingly Democratic delegation to the house of representatives. All seven of its House members were Democrats in the 1949 legislature.

The five leaders in the division's House races are Democrats. All appeared to have margins clear enough to assure their election.

The shift in third division House race standings left the territorial picture this way: Republicans leading for 11 seats in the 24-member House; the Democrats leading for eight; the Democrats leading for second division seats in the dark in the absence of returns from Nome.

Governor Gruening predicted that final returns would show the Democrats in control of the legislature. They had a 19-5 edge in the Senate in the 1949 session and the Senate was divided 8-8. However, the Democrats have six hold-over senators, who were elected in 1948, and the Republicans have only two.

## DRUNK DRIVING—ON HORSE

NEWARK, N. J. — (AP) — They didn't charge Harold B. Wilder with drunk driving or with speeding. Instead they revived the ancient charge of being drunk while on horseback.

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## American Food For Yugoslavia Said Necessary

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Secretary of State Acheson says it will undoubtedly be necessary for the United States to send food to Yugoslavia. A severe drought has cut crop yields there.

Acheson said the matter is being discussed both within the American government and between it and Marshall Tito's independent Communist regime. He said no decisions have been made on the form of the aid.

In response to questions, Acheson also:

1. Denied he had given the French "an ultimatum," as a questioner phrased it, on including German military units in the proposed western defense force. There had been reports from Paris that Acheson's rearmament proposal to the foreign ministers' meeting in New York last month was regarded by the French as "an ultimatum" to agree to use German troops if they want more American troops in Europe.

2. Said he was disappointed that the North Korean Communist regime had not accepted the United Nations general assembly resolution and Gen. Douglas MacArthur's surrender demand based on it. Acheson said the patriotic thing for all Koreans would be to cooperate in restoring peace and unity to their country.

3. The United States, he said, has been kept very fully informed a multi-billion dollar program of assistance to southeast Asia. United States efforts along the same line, he added, will be dovetailed with the British commonwealth efforts.

## One-Ticket Election Of Soviet Rapped By U.S.

BERLIN — (AP) — The United States Wednesday blasted the scheduled one-ticket election in the Soviet zone of Germany as a new obstacle to German unity, and accused the Russians of attempting to "consolidate the Soviet empire in Germany."

The American broadsides, fired by U. S. High Commissioner John J. McCloy, came as Soviet authorities prodded 13,000,000 voters in the Communist people's republic to cast a unanimous endorsement Sunday for the hand-picked single slate of candidates, 70 percent of them Communists.

In a letter to Gen. Vasily Chuikov, Soviet commander in Germany, McCloy said neither the United States nor the West German republic would recognize results of the election.

## SOCE Enrollment Gain Of Three Percent

ASHLAND — Enrollment at Southern Oregon college for 1950-51 is up three percent over last year, Mrs. Mabel Winston, registrar, announced today.

While the increase is not as large as was originally expected, Southern Oregon is the only college in the state with the exception of the law and medical schools in Portland to show a substantial increase, according to the latest available figures, Mrs. Winston said.
