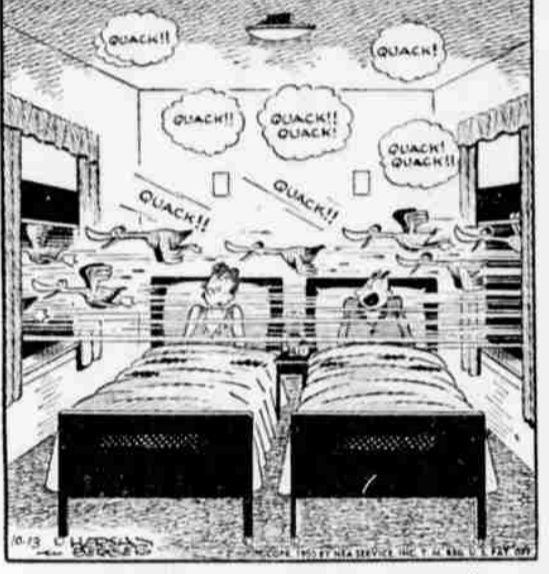

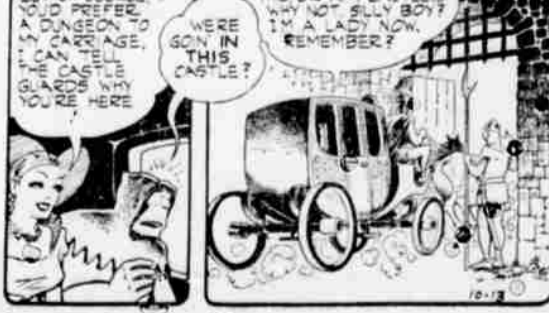

**Blood Recipient Begins To Repay His Debt**

LEBANON — (AP) — A 23-year-old Mormon missionary, who has received 84 pints of blood during a two-year illness, has started repaying his debt by giving a pint of blood to the Red Cross.

**Federal Timber Sales Doubles Last Year's**

PORTLAND — (AP) — Timber sales from federal forests of the region in the months of July, August and September were almost double the first quarter of the last fiscal year.

Regional Forester H. J. Andrews reported revenues of \$7,302,639. All but \$25,334 was from timber. The same quarter a year ago brought in \$3,801,724 and the entire previous fiscal year revenue was \$13,732,124.

Andrews said timber cut and stumpage prices were both higher. The Willamette forest brought in \$972,582; Freemont \$852,381; Mt. Hood \$767,518; Olympia \$747,699; Umpqua \$625,758.

**Slash In Hospital Aid Affects All But Two States**

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Federal construction programs as a result of a \$75,000,000 budget reduction. Most states took a cut of slightly more than 1 percent in federal allocations to assist in building hospitals and health centers under the Hill-Burton act.

Congress authorized a \$150,000,000 federal-aid program for the 12 months ending June 30, 1951. The budget bureau halved the figure Tuesday in apportioning spending cuts required by the general appropriation bill.

The funds are allocated to the states on a matching basis under a formula based on relative population and per capita wealth, with a \$200,000 minimum fixed by law.

Alaska, Delaware and Nevada, each apportioned the \$200,000 minimum under the proposed \$150,000,000 program as announced by the public health service, with previous allocations under the \$150,000,000 program in parentheses, include:

Oregon \$768,012 (\$1,544,000); Washington \$912,428 (\$1,835,000); Alaska \$200,000 (\$200,000).

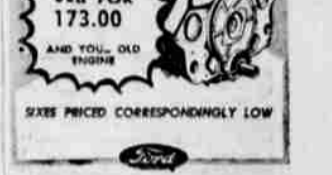
The Miami Sun Sox completed their Florida International League season play against St. Petersburg with 22 wins and no defeats.

Don Brown, president, said the award was made because of the Eugene guild's interest in increasing educational opportunities for students who have decided to enter Journalism as a profession.

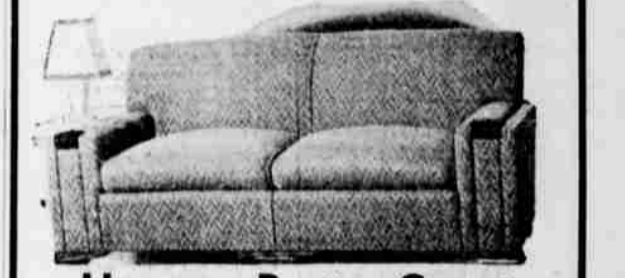
The student to receive the award will be selected by a joint guild and journalism faculty committee.



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
