Major Baseball Teams Pick Up Cream Of Minors

NEW YORK — (AP) — Major league baseball teams, finding it difficult to purchase established stars, are continuing to stock their 1951 rosters with the cream of the nation's minor leaguers.

The National league is especially active. The Pittsburgh Pirates shelled out \$75,000 yesterday to the San Francisco Seals of the Pacific Coast league to obtain pitcher Con Dempsey on a conditional basis.

Dempsey, who was the toast of the Coast league in his rookie year in 1949, will be up with the Pirates for 30 days. Dempsey won 17 and lost 14 in 1949. Last season however he slumped to 8-9 but finished strong.

The St. Louis Cardinals purchased 11 players from their far flung minor league chain. They included third baseman Don Richmond, pitcher Ed Yuhas and outfielder Larry Claflone from their pennant winning Rochester International league team.

Brooklyn called up catcher Dick Teed from their Montreal International league club today and shipped veteran Jim Russell, a switch-hitting outfielder to the Royals in return.

The Cincinnati Reds purchased the crack Tulsa doubleplay combination of shortstop Roy McMillan and second baseman Jack Baumer from their Texas league team.

The Chicago Cubs purchased veteran outfielder Frank Baumholtz and pitcher Cal McLish from their Los Angeles farm on the coast.

Major Teams Of Nation Vie In Big Games

Texas Meets Oklahoma; SMU Risks Position; Army Plays Michigan

NEW YORK — (AP) — Texas, the king-sized state comes up with a king-sized doubleheader tomorrow that promises to give the college grid standings a vigorous shakeup.

Three of the four top teams in the country and a boisterous neighbor which is unbeaten and on a one-two square off in a battle of giants in Dallas' Cotton Bowl.

Oklahoma, third ranked nationally, will throw its 23-game winning streak against ponderous Texas, No. 4, in the afternoon phase of the twin attraction. Southern Methodist and Oklahoma A. and M. will go out under the lights to complete the job.

SMU is ranked second nationally, just behind Army, Oklahoma A. and M. isn't rated but here's a team that was good enough to beat Arkansas and Texas Christian and the Drake.

The two games — with separate admissions — are expected to draw a total of 130,000 fans. A large hunk of Oklahoma's population is moving across the Red River for the doings.

Dallas' doubleheader will snare some of the spotlight from the big game in Yankee stadium where Army's black knights, unbeaten in 22 games, will defend their new No. 1 rating against fired-up, once-beaten Michigan.

This game, the season's major attraction in the east outside the Army-Navy extravaganza, is expected to lure 70,000 into Yankee stadium.

Major Clashes Listed

The college campaign really picks up momentum this week with major conference clashes, vying with intersectional skirmishes for the attention of the gridiron gourmet. The activities actually get under way tonight with Illinois and UCLA, the 1947 Rose Bowl principals, tussling at Los Angeles.

Michigan's Wolverines are expected to be keyed to the game for the meeting with Army and to have their best backfield man, Chuck Ortman, in shape for the first time since the opening game.

The Cadets, who boast a race-horse backfield, never have lost to the Wolverines. Last year they snipped a 25-game Michigan winning streak, 21-7.

At Dallas, Texas is rated a touch down edge over the Sooners, who just squeaked through against Texas A. and M. last week, and SMU, with Kyle Rote at the throttle, is a solid choice over the Oklahoma Aggies.

COUGARS READY

PULLMAN — (AP) — The Washington State college Cougars left here today for Missoula and tomorrow's game with the University of Montana.

The Cougars practiced running plays and defense against the anticipated Grizzly attack up to the last possible minute yesterday. They expect to reach Missoula late today but in time for Coach Forest Evashevski to run them through a brief workout.

The Illinois hopes were dulled in the mud by one point in a 7-6 setback by Wisconsin last Saturday, while the surprising Bruins of UCLA missed out by a similar margin to Washington, 21-30.

The Illini rule a firm, one touch-down favorite tonight. Many observers think it should be larger and hark back to the Rose Bowl game of 1947 when local UCLA admirers made them the favorites over Illinois and then saw the mid-westerners tromp the Bruins by a 45-14 count.
