A meeting of Governor Douglas McKay's farm advisory council of the State Unemployment Compensation commission will be held in Portland on Monday, Oct. 16, to discuss national and state seasonal farm labor problems.

Truman Chase of Eugene, council chairman and the governor's representative of the National Farm Labor conference held recently in Washington, D. C., will report on national developments. Other speakers will include Tom Lawson McCall of the governor's staff and Joseph D. Wilson, farm labor supervisor.

Reports on seasonal farm labor supply and demand in all areas of the state will be made by council members, including Harold Barnett of Pendleton, H. H. Chindgren of Molalla, J. J. Fisher of Gresham, Ammon Grice of Salem, H. G. Hohwiessner of Salem, D. F. Kennedy of Independence, Jared Lewis of Nyssa, Robert K. Norris of Medford, Henry Semon of Klamath Falls and E. C. Ziegler of Hood River.

Because of increasing demands for workers in industry and trade, farm labor problems in 1951 may be more serious than during the season just passing, when shortages of seasonal help became more numerous. The meeting will be at the Portland hotel, starting at 6:30 Monday evening.

Sanitarium attendants say that they do not urge Mr. Jobe to talk any more than necessary because it is difficult for him and they feel that it taxes his strength.

He stays in bed almost constantly although he does sit in a chair when he feels like it, Mrs. Mathews reports.
