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Retention Of Rent Control Has Partial Approval

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Housing Expediter James E. Woods says only 184 of the 3,000 eligible communities so far have taken the action required to retain federal rent control after Dec. 31.

The action required, under present law, is a resolution by the local governing council or a vote by popular referendum in favor of maintaining continued federal control until next June 30. Where no action is taken, decontrol will be automatic Jan. 1.

The municipal court Thursday granted Los Angeles tenants an injunction preventing Expediter Woods from signing an order removing rent controls in Los Angeles.

The temporary injunction, pending hearing set for Monday, was granted by Chief Judge George R. Barse of the municipal court for the District of Columbia.

The action came after an hour of argument on a new petition for an injunction by counsel for the Los Angeles Tenant council.

PORTLAND—(AP)—A campaign to keep the city out of the rent control business gained momentum here today.

Petitions bearing 5169 names were filed at the city hall, and Roy Renoud, president of the Central labor council, said he expected to have 13,282 signatures by Saturday's deadline.

That number is required to force a city-wide vote on the proposal for city rent control. The proposal to substitute city control for federal control is being sponsored in the city council by Commissioner Ormond R. Bean. It is to go before the council Tuesday.

72 Boys Seized While Viewing Obscene Movie

CHICAGO—(AP)—Police raided the basement of a north side home yesterday and seized 72 teen-aged boys who they said were viewing obscene movies.

Juvenile officer Ted Groark said the movies were "shocking, the worst we've ever seen."

Ten of the boys, 17 to 19, will appear in boys' court today on charges of being inmates of a disorderly house. Sixty-two boys from 13 to 16 years of age, will appear in family court.

Police said they were looking for a woman who reportedly rented out the films.

Deaf Mute Deer Hunter Shot Twice In Leg

EUGENE—(AP)—A deaf mute deer hunter is in a hospital here with two bullet wounds in one leg while police today investigated circumstances of the shooting.

Police said Gale Rinehart, Rt. 1, Dallas, was a member of a party of deaf mutes on the hunting excursion near Lorne. He was shot in the right leg and the hospital reported his condition not serious.

Also being investigated is the gun mishap in which LeRoy S. McCay, 14, of Rt. 5, Eugene, had one hand severely injured. The gun went off when his hand was on the muzzle.

Orientation Classes Offered By V.A.
The Veterans administration will give an indoctrination and orientation course Thursday and Friday evenings of this week for all Douglas county volunteers who wish to learn how to help patients to re-adjust themselves to a normal life.

The classes will be held in the library of the special services building at the Veterans hospital. Doctors and other hospital personnel will discuss various types of patients and modern methods of treatment for the psychiatric patient and the role of the volunteer in helping.

Seaman Jailed For Buckingham Palace Robbery

LONDON—(AP)—Douglas Munro, 25-year-old British seaman, was jailed here pending a hearing Oct. 23 on a charge of breaking into Buckingham palace.

A Scotland Yard inspector said Munro was identified by two persons as the man they saw early Friday with a dispatch box stolen from the royal residence.

Munro is formally charged with "burglariously breaking and entering" the palace and stealing a dispatch box, containing correspondence, worth 3 pounds (\$8.40).

The box was taken from the room of Maj. Gen. A. G. Salisbury-Jones, marshal of the diplomatic corps. Salisbury-Jones is a secretary to the king, dealing with diplomatic social correspondence.

Meanwhile, high level investigation was underway at Scotland Yard to determine how the burglar penetrated a screen of detectives, army sentries and alarms which is supposed to protect the royal family from intruders.

One of the devices which failed is an automatic record player which is supposed to operate when the beam from an electric eye is broken.

A loudspeaker at Scotland Yard is then supposed to boom out "Buckingham palace has been entered."

Members of the royal family were all out of the city when the burglary occurred.

Lane County Democrats Gain In Registration

EUGENE—(AP)—The Democrats are continuing their inroads on the Republican majority in Lane county, election deputy Lloyd Payne announced.

The figures, as of Sept. 30, were: Republicans, 35,599; Democrats, 25,341; and miscellaneous, 1,181. Complete figures, through the Oct. 7 deadline, are not available yet.

Portland Laborites Block Rent Control Abolition

PORTLAND—(AP)—City council's local rent control ordinance apparently will gather dust on a shelf.

AFL Central Labor council officials reported they had obtained enough referendum signatures to keep the ordinance from taking effect until a general election balloting. Such a vote can't be held until 1952 and this is after the ordinance would expire.

Meanwhile, federal rent controls continue. They will die automatically Dec. 31 unless the city council takes action tomorrow on an Oregon Apartment House Owners' association request for decontrol.

Lewis And Clark Takes League Lead

Lewis and Clark's pile-driver was still in high gear Saturday night as the Pioneers cut down Pacific university, 24 to 9, to bring their scoring total in two Northwest football conference games to 68 points while holding opponents scoreless.

At Caldwell, the College of Idaho Coyotes, sparked by Levon Scott, opened conference play by defeating Whitman college, 28-20. Scott scored three touchdowns and helped set up the fourth.

Reuben "The Tank" Baisch was a triple touchdown scorer as Lewis and Clark handed Pacific its first home game loss since 1946. The Pioneers picked off touchdowns in each quarter while rolling to 16 first downs against the Badgers' three.

Other conference teams—Willamette and Linfield—played non-league games. The Bears and the University of Hawaii struggled to a 21-21 deadlock in the return game of a series that opened in Honolulu the day before Japanese planes struck Pearl Harbor. Willamette, playing its third game in eight days, ran up a 21-0 lead in the first 18 minutes and then couldn't hold off the rallying Hawaiians.

Linfield set down Southern Oregon College of Education, 34 to 0, with fullback Randall Harrison idled with injuries for two weeks, scoring two last half touchdowns.

John J. Raskob, Backer Of Al Smith, Passes

CENTREVILLE, Md.—(AP)—John J. Raskob, 71, behind-the-scenes political figure of the '30's and a pioneer in the automobile installment-buying plan, died at his estate here yesterday.

As a former chairman of the finance committee of General Motors, and associate of the Du Ponts of Wilmington, Raskob was one of the country's leading industrialists.

But he was most remembered for his political experiences. He dropped out of his business positions in 1928 to back Al Smith in his unsuccessful bid for the presidency.

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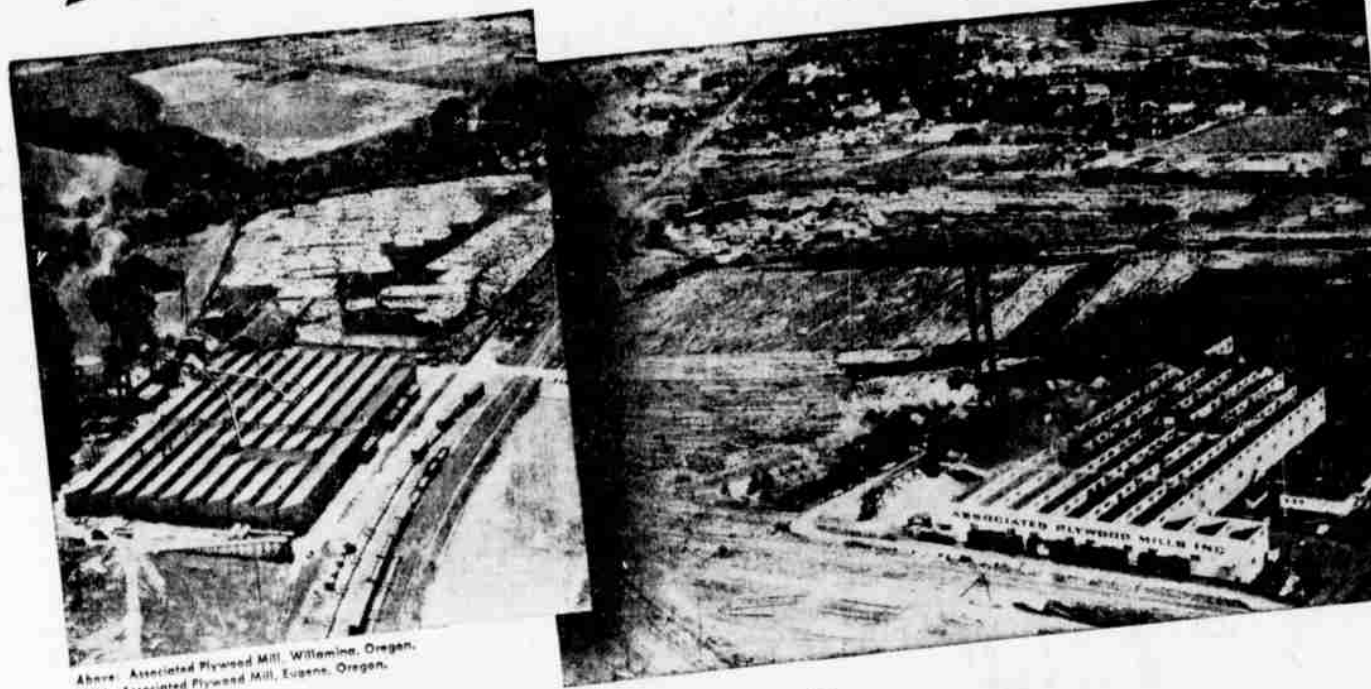
