

Rookie Cop Kills Vet In Battle

PHILADELPHIA — (AP)—While terrified passengers huddled in one end of a car, a rookie policeman shot and killed a 22-year-old navy veteran during a fight in a subway train.

Samuel S. Ellis Jr., died Sunday about an hour after he was shot by Edward Rouch, 23.

Witnesses told police Ellis attacked Rouch with a knife shortly after two companions left the subway. Police were seeking the two companions for questioning. They quoted witnesses as saying they and Ellis had been fighting and that one of the men was believed to have been stabbed by Ellis.

Rouch came out of the battle with knife wounds of the face, head and left arm, a bruised abdomen where Ellis had kicked him, and a bite wound of the left hand.

Ellis had just finished a tour of duty as part of his police college training when he boarded the subway. No charges have been filed against the rookie policeman.
