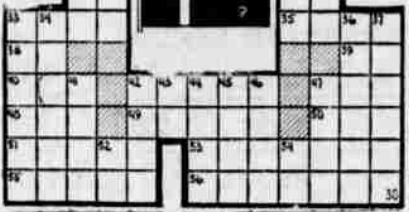
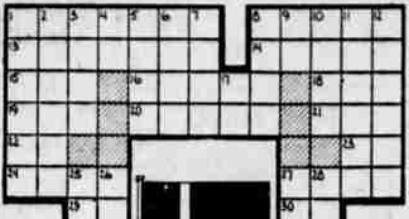
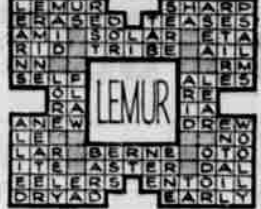

Smallest Wool Output Since 1879 Forecast In U.S.

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Production of wool in this country next year may be the smallest since 1879—a development which would make it more dependent than ever before on foreign supplies.

The Agriculture department forecasts 1951 production of shorn wool at between 210,000,000 and 225,000,000 pounds, compared with 254,000,000 indicated for 1950.

The forecast reflects a sharp and rapid decline in production since 1943, when output set a record of 455,000,000 pounds.

This further drop in production comes at a time when the country needs larger supplies for its defense program.

Sheep raising has declined in recent years largely because it offered smaller financial returns than competitive types of farming.

The department said the decline in production, coupled with prospects of a larger demand, probably would cause prices to go higher next year. They have gone up considerably this year. In September producer prices of shorn wool averaged 62.2 cents a pound, the highest since the government started keeping price records in 1909.

The wool situation will be tight in other parts of the world too, the department said. World consumption of apparel wool during the season ended last June 30 was said to have exceeded production by about 15 to 20 percent. As a

Driver of the northbound bus, C. C. Kinter, route 4, box 302, Eugene, said the bus started to jump around on the snowy pavement.

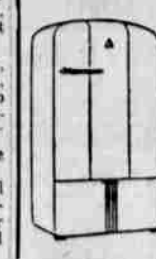

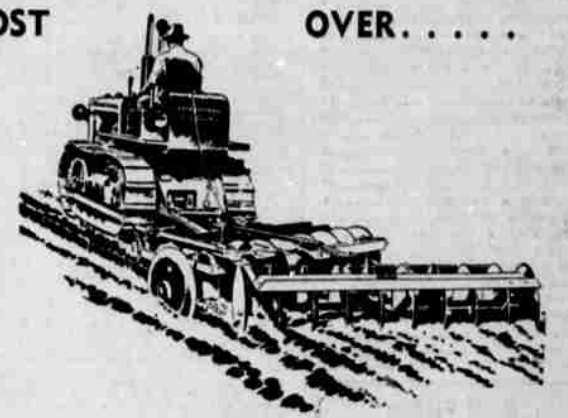
