Morse Is Choice To Be Returned To Senate Post

Republican Wayne Morse was Douglas county's choice to be returned to the U. S. Senate, according to unofficial News-Review tabulations. Morse defeated Howard Latourette, Portland, Democratic candidate, by a substantial margin, with Harlin Talbert, Progressive, of Linn county far behind in county tabulations.
